## **COVID Update**

The great news is that we are back on deck for learning at school tomorrow! Thank goodness! We look forward to seeing all students at 8:45am. During the Mass that I viewed last Sunday, the priest likened Victorians to the lepers in the Gospel story. Certainly, social media has depicted us in this way! It will be good to join the rest of Australia once again, and to enjoy all that this great city offers.

The only change we are making to ensure the safety of the community is as follows:

To reduce the risk of transmission and to help students settle into the day's learning, we ask families to drop off their children at the gate, and not come into the yard. Students are now able to come into the school independently, and staff are on hand to assist, should they need support. *Parents must not enter school buildings without first signing in at the office.* 

The yard will be open in the afternoon for you to meet with your child's teacher. We ask that you wear a mask because we cannot adequately maintain social distancing at this time.

### Communication

We encourage people to download Operoo and Skoolbag. We use both of these apps frequently; they help us to make communication easier and more streamlined.

# **Positive Behaviour for Learning**

We have implemented a new process based on staff feedback for lining up after play breaks. At the first bell students are required to stop playing, go to the toilet and get a drink, if required, and then move to their lines. Students line up in single class lines, listen to any school announcements, and then proceed to classrooms. Our focus is on the transition from play time to learning. Since implementing this process at the commencement of the school year, we have noticed a marked improvement in student focus, and attention to learning.

We have been maintaining a strong focus on our school expectations and we have been continually revising these. Students and staff are in the process of learning to recite these, as they form the basis for all that we do at HR. We ask you to reinforce this work by discussing them with your children, and asking them to name the expectations.

Jane Bennett from MACS will lead our staff in professional learning at Holy Rosary on 17 March where we will take the next steps in implementing Positive Behaviour for Learning at Holy Rosary. School will be closed for students on this day. TeamKids will operate from 7:00am-6:00pm.

# Safety is our Right- A Message from a parent to our community Students crossing roads

"I wanted raise the issue again this year of some parents disregarding the No Standing zones around the school during drop off and pick up times. This lazy and selfish behaviour endangers the small children who cannot be seen behind large vehicles when crossing roads."

# **Holy Rosary Parish Education Board**

The Holy Rosary Parish Education Board (PEB) was established late 2018 as a collaboration between the Parish, School and Parents. PEB members represent the voice of the greater school community in providing advice to Fr Hien and Christine on various aspects of school life.

PEB members meet 8 times a year, roughly twice each school term. We encourage parents to contact us with input, queries or concerns that can be raised at meetings and then communicated back to the school community. Note that the PEB does not discuss staffing or curriculum. Questions regarding these should be directed directly to the school.

Some of the activities the PEB undertook in 2020 included the review of Outside Hours School Care providers, the logo and uniform, feedback on the transition to learning at home and the transition back to onsite learning, and reviewing new school policies. PEB members are also participating in the development of the 10 year master plan for the school.

With COVID continuing its impact into 2021, the consolidation to a single uniform supplier with online ordering will be one of the many activities the PEB will undertake this year. # **Sporting Clinics**

### **Cross Country Tryouts**

On Friday March 12th, we will be running our tryouts for the District Cross Country. Students who were born in 2008/09, 2010 and 2011/12 and are interested in distance running are welcome to try out. I strongly encourage that students complete some training prior to this, particularly if they have never run long distances before so they learn to pace themselves and get a feel for the distance. Students who are born in 2008/09 will run 2 km and the other two age groups will run 3 km. I will send more information about the tryouts closer to the date.

### **Team Vic Tryouts**

If your child is turning ten or over next year and they are considered gifted or elite in their sporting field, you may like to enter them into the state trials to represent Victoria in the National finals next year. I have included the link below, where you can click on the sport that your child is involved in, and this will give you further information, such as when the closing date for entries is, as well as the entry requirements. These championships offer gifted and talented students the opportunity to participate in higher levels of sporting competition against students from other Australian States and Territories.

Participation in a School Sport Victoria Team is self-funded. As a guide it may cost between \$2,000-\$3,000 to participate. Costs may include uniforms, host state levies, flights, transport, accommodation and meals. Costs will vary depending on the location of the championship, and accommodation requirements."

### **Dear Families**

Invoice/statements were sent out yesterday. If you paid fees via EFT or direct debit in January or up until 16 February, these payments will not appear on your statement. We are now able to receipt 2021 payments and you will receive receipts shortly.

Fees are sent as an annual invoice but there are several payment options available:

- 1. In three equal instalments by 22 March, June 21 and September 13; OR
- 2. Annual payment of fees in full by March 22; OR
- 3. Ten equal instalments from February to November on the 22nd of the month
- 4. Via direct debit/electronic funds transfer in instalments that work for your family.

Attached to this newsletter is a Direct Debit form for your family to complete if you wish to pay by direct debit. Please note direct debits are only available from a bank account and not a credit card.

Camp Sports and Excursion Fund (CSEF) applications are now open for families who hold a valid, means tested Concession Card/Health Care Card. If successful in your application, these funds (\$125 per child) are paid to the school and used to offset the cost of excursions and camps.

Heath Care Card/Pension Card holders are also eligible for reduced fees (up to \$800 discount per family on the family fee of \$1800). Attached is a CSEF application form.

# Speech & Drama Lessons 2021

Students who would like to commence Speech & Drama Lessons in 2021 please follow the trybooking link to enrol in this program.

Speech & Drama lessons are a fun and dynamic way of building students' confidence in public speaking, communication and performance skills. Speech & Drama lessons aim to improve diction, improve voice projection and develop natural expression of the spoken word.

The course will include skills such as vocal exercises, storytelling, improvisation, presentation skills and drama. Fun, relaxed examinations will be undertaken as part of this program in November of each year. The extra cost of this examination will be \$30-50 depending on your child's level and by enrolling in this program, you agree for your child to take part in an examination.

### Timetabling and lesson times

Year 1 to 6 classes are 30minutes in duration and are conducted during school hours on Fridays. To avoid missing the same class, lesson times will vary from week to week rotating on Fridays. Each student is required to bring a plastic display folder to every lesson.

# Fees for 7 Lessons per Term:

Group of four or more \$160.00

# Make up lessons

It is the responsibility of the student to attend lessons, however, if a student is unable to attend a timetabled lesson, a make- up lesson will be arranged, where possible, subject to the teacher being notified in advance. (One week's notice is required. Absences without notice will not be made up which is in line with current industrial law whereby the teacher is entitled to a full days' salary once he/she is contracted to teach.)

One school terms written notice is required if enrolment is to be cancelled, or a fee equivalent to 50% of the series charge will be made, unless the withdrawal is on the recommendation of the teacher.




