School Policies

As you are aware Melbourne Archdiocese Catholic Schools (MACS) are now the governing body for our Catholic schools. In this role, MACS has outlined consistent policies for all Catholic Schools. There are some important expectations that are central to the health and wellbeing of our students and their families. These expectations are consistent with policies that have been integral to our school in the past.

It is to be expected that in a school community, at times, there will be conflict and differences of opinion. It is how we manage these issues that determines the strength of our community. Should there be issues that impact you and your children, we ask you to contact our staff to assist you to resolve the conflict or issue. Our staff are here to support you and your child. The first point of call is your child's class teacher. As staff, we are able to approach situations in an objective way. We ask you please....

- do not approach a student on the yard under any circumstances
- do **not** contact another parent to discuss their child whether in person, by phone, email or text.

How do I learn more about my child's progress?

Staff are on the yard each afternoon. This is to allow you to make contact with them in an easy manner. We recognise that personal meetings have been limited due to COVID and should you wish, we encourage you to ask your child's teacher for an appointment to discuss your child's progress. These appointments can be held in person or via GoogleMeet.

NAPLAN Online 2021

NAPLAN is a common measure for all Australian students that provides evidence of literacy and numeracy achievement and progress at system, school and student levels. It is a point-in-time assessment that allows parents to see how their child is progressing in literacy and numeracy against the national standard, compared to their Australian peers. Together with the results of student learning in the curriculum areas and the ongoing monitoring of their literacy and numeracy skills through monitoring tools, NAPLAN provides additional information to support teachers' professional judgement about student progress and informs class learning and teaching programs.

In May, students in Years 3 and 5 will participate in online NAPLAN testing. Students will participate in four tests - Writing, Reading, Language of Conventions and Numeracy. Students in Year 5 will complete all tests online. Year 3 students will complete their writing test on paper. Our students will complete NAPLAN Online using school devices. They bring headsets from home. NAPLAN online is a tailored test that adapts to students responses, providing better assessment of student skills and knowledge, and more precise results.

We are committed to ensuring our students are ready for NAPLAN Online. On Thursday 25th March students in Years 3 and 5 will have an opportunity to experience the NAPLAN Online environment as they participate in a practice test. No marks will be recorded for these tests. The purpose is to let the students experience working in the NAPLAN Online environment in test conditions.
