

Yesterday we had our school photos. We thank you for taking the time to ensure your children were dressed appropriately and groomed beautifully. The photographers commented on the excellent manner of our students and they appreciated the way they listened and followed instructions.

#### **Parish Education Board**

Last week we held our AGM for the Parish Education Board which was chaired by Damien Murray. There were 12 parents who joined us for this meeting. We congratulate Laura Cochrane and Leona Jackson on their election to the Parish Education Board. We also thank Pilar Abou Haila and Jen Reynolds who nominated for the PEB. We sincerely thank Amanda Muscat and Laura Carra who now step down from the PEB. Their dedication, commitment, perspective and hard work has been greatly appreciated.

MACS (Melbourne Archdiocese Catholic Schools) has organised a zoom meeting for principals and parish priests for early in the new term to discuss the new School Advisory Council which will replace the PEB. We will keep you posted on the outcome of this meeting.

#### **Teacher Shortage**

In recent weeks the media has reported a teacher shortage across the state. As part of these reports, it was identified that the recent employment of tutors in schools has provided jobs for many who would usually be doing casual relief teaching. At HR we budget to ensure casual relief staff cover teachers and learning support officers when they are away sick. Already this year we have had one occasion where the agency was unable to provide sufficient teachers for us. Fortunately, we were able to cover this position internally at this time, however, the reality is that as winter approaches and illness hits a peak this may be more problematic. We share this information with you so that you can best prepare your children, and explain that on some occasions they may have to be split up into small groups to work in another classroom should teachers not be available.

#### **Fundraising Team**

Last week Christine met with our two co-chairs of our Fundraising Group; Clare Mitchell and Naomi Smith to discuss opportunities for fundraising and socialising in 2021. Clare and Naomi are well supported by Jess Murray (Secretary) and Jane Merrington (Treasurer), and a wonderful support tribe. We encourage all families to get involved in the team's activities as a way of supporting our school while making fabulous friendships. Keep your eye on the newsletter for news of upcoming events. We also thank and acknowledge Lucy Hegan, our 2019 outgoing chair, who worked hard to ensure a year full of fun activities for all in our community and much financial success.

We are looking for parent representatives for each class from Prep-Year 2. Your role is to initiate year level activities and to assist the Fundraising Team to get the word out amongst parents about official school events.

#### **Uniforms**

For some time we have entertained the idea of moving our uniforms offsite. The feedback was that parents enjoyed the convenience of uniforms being onsite. Although, we would like to continue to provide this service for our families, we have had to make the difficult decision to move the uniforms offsite. This will commence in Term 2 as we now have limited stock.

This decision was made after consulting with the school accountant. We hold about \$50000-\$60000 worth of stock and the office staff are responsible for the ordering, stocktake and the sale of uniforms. Providing this service is time consuming, particularly as the office staff must move back and forth from the uniform shop, as required. The accountant estimates that providing the uniforms onsite costs the school in the vicinity of \$48000 which of course is money we could spend on learning and teaching.

In addition, the uniform shop is a space that we will use for alternate activities. Currently, we do not have enough quiet and confidential spaces for visiting specialists such as speech pathologists and psychologists, and we must use offices of leadership team members. This can work reasonably well but again it can be challenging when staff, parents or students need a space to discuss an issue or to debrief. Instrumental music is held in the staffroom and the uniform shop could provide a space for this, enabling staff to eat and chat in the staffroom if they are scheduled for lunch during class time.

We have opted to move our uniform sales to Noone. They offer a one stop shop for all items except shoes and they are price comparable. They are located in Niddrie and uniform shopping can be done onsite or online. Items can be delivered to school for free or to home for a delivery fee. We are in the process of organising this changeover and will advise you of the contact details in Term 2.

#### And, finally....

We send our warm wishes to you all for a happy and holy Easter and a safe, relaxing and rejuvenating break. We look forward to seeing you all back at school on Monday 19 April.

The money donated may purchase a waterpoint in a community in Tanzania or much needed beds in refugee camps in Bangladesh. We congratulate everyone in our school for their efforts and we are very proud of the way our children have put their compassion into action.

To ensure you are ordering school photos for the current year, please wait for notifications that 2021 images are online before placing orders.



# Speech & Drama lessons 2021

#### Term 2

Students who would like to commence Speech & Drama Lessons in 2021 please follow the trybooking link to enrol in this program.

Speech & Drama lessons are a fun and dynamic way of building students confidence in public speaking, communication and performance skills. Speech & Drama lessons aim to improve diction, improve voice projection and develop natural expression of the spoken word.

The course will include skills such as vocal exercises, storytelling, improvisation, presentation skills and drama. Fun relaxed examinations will be undertaken as part of this program in November of each year. The extra cost of this examination will be \$30-50 depending on your child's level and by enrolling in this program you agree for your child to take part in an examination.

#### **Timetabling and lesson times**

Year 1 to 6 classes are 30minutes in duration and are conducted during school hours on Fridays. To avoid missing the same class, lesson times will vary from week to week rotating on Fridays. Each student is required to bring a plastic display folder to every lesson.

#### Fees for 9 Lessons per Term 2:

Group of four or more \$206.00

#### Make up lessons

It is the responsibility of the student to attend lessons, however if a student is unable to attend a timetabled lesson, a make- up lesson will be arranged where possible subject to the teacher being notified in advance. (One week's notice is required. Absences without notice will not be made up which is in line with current industrial law whereby the teacher is entitled to a full days' salary once he/she is contracted to teach.) One school terms written notice is required if enrolment is to be cancelled, or a fee equivalent to 50% of the series charge will be made, unless the withdrawal is on the recommendation of the teacher.


