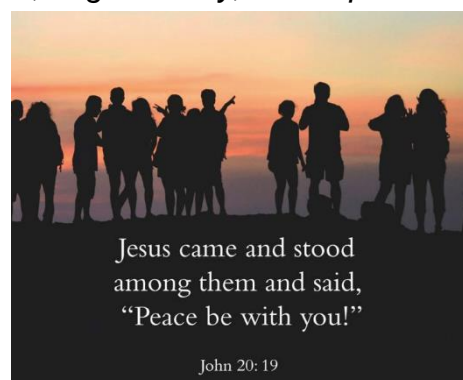
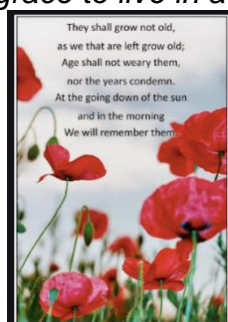

Happy Easter

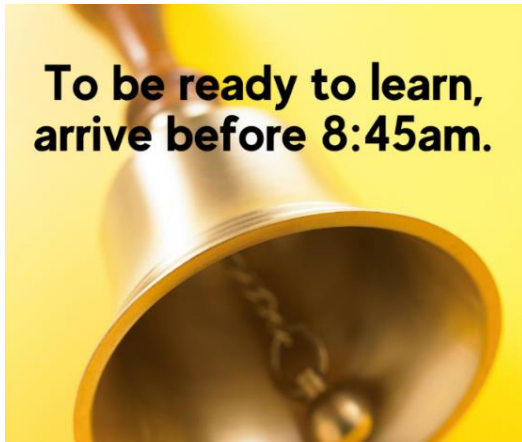
Welcome back to Term 2. We hope that you enjoyed a relaxing and rejuvenating break over Easter, and took the time to relax with family and friends. Students and staff have settled in quickly to the routines of this new term.

Here's to a term that overflows with the life and peace of the risen Lord. The Easter season lasts for 50 days and therefore, students and staff will celebrate with our Easter liturgy on 28 April.

The term ahead will be busy and we've added some extra dates to our calendar to help you with your planning.

Maximising Learning Time

Our Positive Behaviour for Learning Team (PBL) has been working to maximise class learning time. We recognise that interruptions are inevitable and acknowledge that some interruptions are for valuable purposes such as extra curricular classes, including instrumental music and Speech and Drama. However, we can look at ways to minimise interruptions and maximise learning time. Interruptions are not just for a few minutes, but for the period immediately after the interruption. Once students have been distracted, they usually need to be redirected.



To ensure we maximise learning time we have made several changes to our routines commencing on Tuesday 27 April. The first one involves students and families. The gate will continue to open at 8:30am and on arrival at school, students should bring their phones to the office. Please do not arrive earlier than 8:30am as there is no teacher supervision at this time.

Students can then remain on the yard until the bell rings at 8:45am. They will then line up at their class lines and their teacher will walk them to class. Once classes have entered the building, doors will be locked. Late students will be required to go to the office for a late pass.

We ask families to make a special effort to get to school by 8:45am. We understand that getting to school on time can be challenging, but punctuality is a valuable life skill. When students are late, connection and learning time is lost and peers are interrupted.

In Victoria ANZAC Day is celebrated on the 25th April, no matter what day it falls. This year it falls on a Sunday and will be celebrated on this day. Therefore, school will be open as usual on Monday.

COVID Update

The Victorian Government relaxed its [COVIDSafe settings](#) on 26 March, allowing more visitors in the home, changes to mask wearing in some settings and updates to density limits in some settings. There are limited changes for schools.

We continue to welcome visitors in small groups, however, face masks must be carried by individuals 12 years and over at all times, and worn when physical distancing of 1.5 metres cannot be maintained. We are unable to have school events such as assemblies because we do not have a venue large enough to

provide appropriate distancing for students, staff and families. Hopefully, this will change in the near future.

As the cooler weather approaches, we remind you to keep your children home if they are unwell and seek a COVID test and isolate if they display possible signs of COVID-

fever, chills or sweats, cough, sore throat, shortness of breath or respiratory illness, runny nose and loss or change in sense of smell or taste.

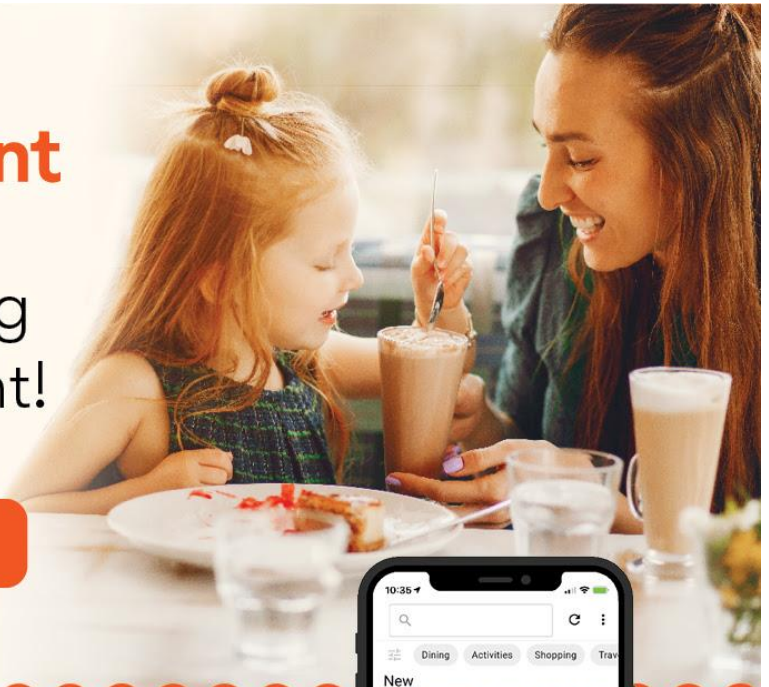

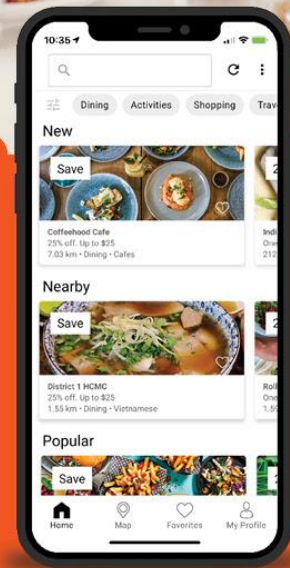

FOR THE BAKERS

Any delicious cakes, slices, and biscuits are required.

Traditional stall favourites include yo yos, slices (caramel, hedgehog, lemon, rocky road), biscuits, syrup cakes, chocolate balls, brownies and unfilled sponge cakes.

Large cakes are especially popular as well as Gluten free items.

FOR THE PRESERVERS

Jams, curds, sweet & savoury sauces, tomato passata, relishes, pickles, pesto, etc are all brilliant sellers.

FOR THE NON BAKERS

FOOD SAFETY REGULATIONS

1. LABELLING

Completion of an ingredient tag is required for each item you produce. Tags will be available after school from Monday 26th April to Wednesday 5th May, along with a 'how to' instruction guide.

2. INGREDIENTS

Cakes can include cooked eggs and dairy products but **must not contain any raw eggs or dairy products including cream, cream cheese or yoghurt in fillings, icing or toppings.** Unfortunately we do not have refrigeration to store and sell these types of cakes.

3. FOOD SAFETY TIPS:

Always wash your hands before cooking (children in particular!).

Ensure food is sealed prior to transporting from home to school (either in cellophane or in a sealed container) to prevent contamination.

4. PACKAGING/PRESENTATION

Experience has shown that items sell faster if they are well packaged and presented. To enhance the presentation of your delicious food, a pink and white colour scheme is used for labelling and wrapping. All packaging is supplied by the school and available after school from Mon 26th April to Wed 5th May. If you can't collect the packaging, items can be wrapped by the volunteers at time of delivery.

CAKES

Please place cakes on white china, white melamine or silver cake board and wrap using clear cellophane and pink ribbon. Cake boards and wrapping will be available from Monday 26th April. If you have any good condition pretty vintage plates (no chips or cracks) and pink ribbon we would welcome you wrapping with these, or donating them for use by others. Perhaps you still have your plate from last year. We would welcome the opportunity to recycle it for you. Purchasers will be able to keep their plates as well as food on them.

SLICES

If slices are your speciality, slice boxes and doilies will be available for use. Place the slice in the box and into one of the suitably sized cello bags provided. Tie with ribbon and attach an ingredient label.

BISCUITS & SMALL TREATS

Assorted cellophane bags for packaging smaller items such as biscuits, chocolate balls etc. will be available for your convenience.

JAM, RELISH & OTHER PRESERVES

For the jam and relish cooks we have jars and lids available for collection from the school office. We ask you to indicate what you plan to make upon collection of the jars so that specially designed holy rosary jam/relish labels can be printed and adhered to your jars.

DELIVERY

Please deliver items on **Friday 7th May** to the Mercy Hall **between 2:00pm and 4:30pm.**

All donations will be gratefully accepted. If you are unable to wrap but would like to contribute, we're happy to wrap for you.

If you're unable to deliver to school on Friday afternoon, you are welcome to deliver to the cake stall on Saturday morning (**before 10am**) or contact Jane or Naomi to make other arrangements. We are however encouraging earlier bakers to bring their items the day before to ensure everything is labelled correctly and priced prior to sale. This can be time consuming for those manning the stall on the day and your assistance in this regard would be greatly appreciated.

Our mother's day cake stall is a popular annual local event with many people eagerly anticipating the delicious food that will be on offer. Come along and take home a special treat to spoil mum and support Holy Rosary.

Speech & Drama lessons 2021

Term 2

Students who would like to commence Speech & Drama Lessons in 2021 please follow the trybooking link to enrol in this program.

Speech & Drama lessons are a fun and dynamic way of building students confidence in public speaking, communication and performance skills. Speech & Drama lessons aim to improve diction, improve voice projection and develop natural expression of the spoken word.

The course will include skills such as vocal exercises, storytelling, improvisation, presentation skills and drama. Fun relaxed examinations will be undertaken as part of this program in November of each year. The extra cost of this examination will be \$30-50 depending on your child's level and by enrolling in this program you agree for your child to take part in an examination.

Timetabling and lesson times

Year 1 to 6 classes are 30minutes in duration and are conducted during school hours on Fridays. To avoid missing the same class, lesson times will vary from week to week rotating on Fridays.

Each student is required to bring a plastic display folder to every lesson.

Fees for 9 Lessons per Term 2 :

Group of four or more \$206.00

Make up lessons

It is the responsibility of the student to attend lessons, however if a student is unable to attend a timetabled lesson, a make- up lesson will be arranged where possible subject to the teacher being notified in advance. (One week's notice is required. Absences without notice will not be made up which is in line with current industrial law whereby the teacher is entitled to a full days' salary once he/she is contracted to teach.)

One school terms written notice is required if enrolment is to be cancelled, or a fee equivalent to 50% of the series charge will be made, unless the withdrawal is on the recommendation of the teacher.
