Holy Rosary School is committed to the safety, wellbeing and protection of all children in our care.

#### **Tutoring program**

You may have become aware of the Government's promise to provide additional funding to schools to assist students who may have been disadvantaged and fallen behind academically due to COVID. The money given to each school was allocated according to the SES of the school. Holy Rosary received \$15,000. Government stipulation is that this money must be used to provide teacher intervention and this equates to about three hours a week in total. In recognition of the challenges faced by our Prep students in 2020, we provided additional support via a recently graduated teacher in Term 4. This year, we have continued to provide an LSO in Prep in recognition that early intervention is preferable. In Year 1 and 2 we continue to have LSO support, and our class numbers remain low; about 20.

We have also extended our intervention staff hours. This means that we have 6 days of intervention in Semester 1 provided by Ruth and Sarah, and 3 days of intervention in Semester 2. Ant also continues to support teachers in this area. Intervention time is allocated to students based on data gained from early assessments and your child's teacher will advise you if your child is receiving additional support. In some cases, students performing above expectation may also be provided with additional short term support. This is to ensure that all students have the opportunity to experience a year's academic growth. Maria continues to support classroom teachers with modelling of teaching strategies and facilitated planning, to ensure staff keep refining their skills and providing high quality learning and teaching opportunities for our students.

#### **School Closure**

Each year Catholic Schools are allocated days, via the industrial agreement, to be used to provide staff with professional learning. This year we will use our first day on Wednesday 17 March to undertake further work in the area of Positive Behaviour for Learning. This is part of our continuing focus on improving student behaviour and increasing independence to ensure students feel safe and secure at school, and optimal time is given to learning. We have already made significant inroads in this area and having this ongoing focus should see us continue to grow and improve in this way. Our upcoming session will be facilitated by Jane Bennett from MACS.

I have included the link below, where you can click on the sport that your child is involved in, and this will give you further information, such as when the closing date for entries is, as well as the entry requirements.

"These championships offer gifted and talented students the opportunity to participate in higher levels of sporting competition against students from other Australian States and Territories.

Participation in a School Sport Victoria Team Vic state team is self-funded. As a guide it may cost between \$2,000-\$3,000 to participate. Costs may include uniforms, host state levies, flights, transport, accommodation and meals. Costs will vary depending on the location of the Championship, and Accommodation requirements." ## Speech & Drama Lessons 2021

Students who would like to commence Speech & Drama Lessons in 2021 please follow the trybooking link to enrol in this program.

Speech & Drama lessons are a fun and dynamic way of building students' confidence in public speaking, communication and performance skills. Speech & Drama lessons aim to improve diction, improve voice projection and develop natural expression of the spoken word.

The course will include skills such as vocal exercises, storytelling, improvisation, presentation skills and drama. Fun, relaxed examinations will be undertaken as part of this program in November of each year. The extra cost of this examination will be \$30-50 depending on your child's level and by enrolling in this program, you agree for your child to take part in an examination.

#### Timetabling and lesson times

Year 1 to 6 classes are 30minutes in duration and are conducted during school hours on Fridays. To avoid missing the same class, lesson times will vary from week to week rotating on Fridays. Each student is required to bring a plastic display folder to every lesson.

### Fees for 7 Lessons per Term:

Group of four or more \$160.00

### Make up lessons


It is the responsibility of the student to attend lessons, however, if a student is unable to attend a timetabled lesson, a make- up lesson will be arranged, where possible, subject to the teacher being notified in advance. (One week's notice is required. Absences without notice will not be made up which is in line with current industrial law whereby the teacher is entitled to a full days' salary once he/she is contracted to teach.)

One school terms written notice is required if enrolment is to be cancelled, or a fee equivalent to 50% of the series charge will be made, unless the withdrawal is on the recommendation of the teacher.
