Celebrating 200 Years of Catholic Education

The bicentenary commemorates the anniversary of the first official Catholic school in Australia, founded in October 1820! The Holy Rosary community, both past and present, came out to support the fundraiser, and to enjoy a catch up. The Kensington community spirit was alive and well.

This fundraiser was exceptionally well organised in every way. We particularly recognise Jane Edwards and Naomi Smith who coordinated the stall from start to finish with an exceptional attention to detail (and some superb baking skills from Jane!) They were keenly supported by a host of parents; baking and cooking from home, packing and pricing, setting up and packing up the stall and serving the crowds. We also thank and appreciate Annie who allowed us to use the area outside White Rabbit Record Bar as our sales area.

While it was a fantastic fundraiser, making \$4655.84 it was an even better Holy Rosary gathering. Thank you all for your hard work and efforts.

School Expectations

As you know, we have been working with our students on our school expectations:

Safety is our Right; Learning is our Responsibility; Respect is our Way.

Our students are growing in awareness of the need to manage talking and noise in the corridors, and in classrooms to ensure others can learn.

Our focus for PBL (Positive Behavious For Learning) has been transitioning from play to learning. Our Learning Intentions for he next 2 weeks are;

• We are learning to transition from play in a quiet, safe and respectful manner

• We are learning to move through the school in a quiet, safe and respectful manner.

Last week a staff member noticed that the library was particularly busy with several staff working with students, some staff working independently, and 2Sky borrowing at the same time. She reported, "I was amazed that we could share the space peacefully. I didn't need to remind students to be quiet. I think we can be proud of our students following the school expectations." This is great news and we are particularly proud of 2Sky. We acknowledged their great efforts in front of the school on Monday.

Brain Food

At Holy Rosary it has been customary for students to snack on fruits and vegetables an hour before lunch each day. The idea is to provide a quick, nutritious bite to eat to stave off hunger before lunch- which is at 11:00am. If your child would like to have brain food at this time, we ask that the food is restricted to non-messy fruit and vegetables only and that it is packed into a small, named container. We suggest that these snacks are minimal- some cut up apple, carrot, celery, snow peas or a banana. The small container can be brought to the classroom to save the disruption of trips to bags. It is not appropriate to bring lunch boxes in because of the space they take, often becoming a tripping hazard.

Adventure Playground

As part of our OHS practice the lower playground can only be accessed by students when a teacher is present. At play times they must wait until a teacher arrives before going down to play. With this in mind, and to assist in keeping our area free from weekend visitors we will be locking the lower playground after school and on weekends. It will still be accessible to TeamKids.

Prep students 2022

Current families should have submitted enrolments for Prep 2022 and the required documentation. Thank you to families who have promoted Holy Rosary in the community. NAPLAN 2021



The NAPLAN testing window for 2021 is open from Tuesday 11 May - Friday 21 May. Our timetable for our students sitting the Naplan tests is as follows:

Tuesday 11 May: Writing Wednesday 12 May: Reading Thursday 13 May: Language Conventions Friday 14 May: Numeracy

All tests in each of the subject areas, for both Year 3 and Year 5 students, will begin at 9:30am.

We have set aside Monday 17 May and Tuesday 18 May as our 'catch-up' days with tests also beginning at 9:30am. These catch-up sessions are for students who were absent due to illness during the scheduled timetable.

All children **must** have headphones. Due to hygiene issues, children must not share headphones. We have some leftover at school from remote learning last year but not enough for everyone. It would be preferable for your children to use their own headphones, however, if this is an issue, advise your child's teacher immediately.

Headphones serve two vital purposes:

- 1. To block out the ambient noise during the test
- 2. Some of the items on the tests have audio accompanying the questions and students need to listen for the prompts



Helpful Hints for Parents and children during NAPLAN week

1. Encourage confidence- your child will do well when they feel that 'giving the tests their best shot' is all that you expect.

 Discuss feelings and concerns: Feeling a little anxious is normal, show empathy and listen to fears. Perhaps share times when you have felt this way before tests when you went to school.
 Maintain a positive attitude: Continue to be approachable

and encourage interest in their usual after school activities. This allows children to feel safe and secure.

4. Prepare your child: Have them go to bed early, have breakfast, have a bottle of water and a **nutritious** lunch/ snacks prepared.

- 5. Arrive at school on time.
- 6. Keep Perspective: This is just a series of tests in time; just one form of assessment: success is not determined by these tests.

Naplan News For all Parents and students:

To give our Year 3 and 5 students every opportunity for success we have decided to administer the NAPLAN tests in the morning blocks. To this end, we have scheduled some changes to the regular timetable. Some PE lessons have changed. Other classes have not been affected.

premiers' treading challenge

Victorian Premiers' Reading Challenge

The Victorian Premiers' Reading Challenge is now open and Holy Rosary School is excited to be participating. The PRC application offers a range of exciting features including:

- access to a PRC library catalogue (including book images and blurbs)
- a modern user-friendly interface
- rewarding students with badges as challenge milestones are achieved
- the option for students to mark books as a favourite, give them a star rating or complete a book review

The Challenge is open to all Victorian children from birth to Year 10 in recognition of the importance of reading for literacy development. It is not a competition; but a personal challenge for children to read a set number of books by 17 September 2021.

Children from Prep to Year 2 are encouraged to read or 'experience' 30 books with their parents and teachers. Children from Year 3 to Year 10 are challenged to read 15 books.

Classroom teacher will give student a Victorian Premiers' Reading Challenge (VPRC) username and passcode. Children can view their dashboard and add their books by logging in Challenge application: <u>https://vprc.eduweb.vic.gov.au/home</u>

All children who meet the Challenge will receive a certificate of achievement signed by the Victorian Premier and former Premiers.



Speech & Drama lessons 2021

Term 2

Students who would like to commence Speech & Drama Lessons in 2021 please follow the trybooking link to enrol in this program.

Speech & Drama lessons are a fun and dynamic way of building students confidence in public speaking, communication and performance skills. Speech & Drama lessons aim to improve diction, improve voice projection and develop natural expression of the spoken word.

The course will include skills such as vocal exercises, storytelling, improvisation, presentation skills and drama. Fun relaxed examinations will be undertaken as part of this program in November of each year. The extra cost of this examination will be \$30-50 depending on your child's level and by enrolling in this program you agree for your child to take part in an examination.

Timetabling and lesson times

Year 1 to 6 classes are 30minutes in duration and are conducted during school hours on Fridays. To avoid missing the same class, lesson times will vary from week to week rotating on Fridays. Each student is required to bring a plastic display folder to every lesson.

Fees for 9 Lessons per Term 2 :

Group of four or more \$206.00

Make up lessons

It is the responsibility of the student to attend lessons, however if a student is unable to attend a timetabled lesson, a make- up lesson will be arranged where possible subject to the teacher being notified in advance. (One week's notice is required. Absences without notice will not be made up which is in line with current industrial law whereby the teacher is entitled to a full days' salary once he/she is contracted to teach.) One school terms written notice is required if enrolment is to be cancelled, or a fee equivalent to 50% of the series charge will be made, unless the withdrawal is on the recommendation of the teacher.
