It's going to be another big term as we prepare for our school review, support students involved in Reconciliation, Eucharist and Confirmation, prepare students for our school production, further refine our approach towards Positive Behaviour for Learning, continue our work in writing with staff and students and offer many more wonderful learning experiences from Prep-6.

#### Some Reminders...

Students are invited to come on to the school yard when a teacher is present on duty at 8:30am. The bell rings at 8:45am which means that all students are expected to be lined up, ready for learning at this time. We have some students who regularly arrive after 8:50am which causes delays in the office, interrupts and impacts other students and your child's preparation for learning. After school the yard is supervised until 3:40pm. All families are asked to be off the site by then so that the duty teacher can move punctually to staff meetings and professional learning.

#### News From the Sustainability Student Action Group



The new Ecobin recycling bins have arrived for all of our classrooms! Each classroom now has a paper recycling, a soft plastic, a landfill and a compost bin as well as mixed recycling bins available around the school. We hope that this will significantly reduce the amount of waste Holy Rosary sends to landfill.

We have also revamped our composting system and the Sustainability Student Action Group held a competition to design faces on our

compost bins. You can see the two winning designs they chose below. We will be holding a naming

competition over the next week asking all students to suggest names for our new composting buddies. The Sustainability Student Action Group is open to any students from Years Three to Six and meets fortnightly to look at ways to make our school more sustainable. It is fabulous to see more than a third of our students in Years Three to Six are part of the group and choose to give up their lunchtime to make sure we are doing what we can to be more sustainable.



#### **Curriculum News**



As well as Positive Behaviour for Learning, our other key Professional Learning focus for staff this year is to further develop capacity to effectively teach writing from Prep - 6. We have adopted the Writer's Workshop model where we endeavour to strike the balance between explicit instruction and giving students the voice and space to be creative in their writing.



During the Writer's Workshop sessions, our students have the opportunity to develop a Writer's Notebook. Many published authors such as Mem Fox, Emily Rodda and Paul Jennings use notebooks to 'spark' ideas for writing and

we're doing the same!

A writer's notebook is a tool students use to record the things they notice, observe, and think about. Each recording is called an 'entry'. The entries can be any of a variety of ideas. The most common are:

- memories
- observations of the things happening around them
  - descriptions of people and places important in their

lives

- opinions
- wonderings
- wishes
- family stories, hobbies and other passions.



Our Year 2 students have designed 'Heart Maps' consisting of what they feel is important in their lives. They've included some of the ideas above. We're excited sparked' as a result!

#### **Professional Learning: Writing**



Teachers meet as a staff and in Professional Learning Teams (PLT) to discuss ways that students can engage in the writing process. They use up-to-date data and proven strategies to inspire, spark and support writing

development. Our last PLT was enthusiastic and conversations amongst staff was focussed on the nuts and bolts of the Writing Workshop structure.

## Speech & Drama lessons 2021

#### Term 3

Students who would like to commence Speech & Drama Lessons please follow the trybooking link to enrol in this program.

Speech & Drama lessons are a fun and dynamic way of building students confidence in public speaking, communication and performance skills. Speech & Drama lessons aim to improve diction, improve voice projection and develop natural expression of the spoken word.

The course will include skills such as vocal exercises, storytelling, improvisation, presentation skills and drama. Fun relaxed examinations will be undertaken as part of this program in November of each year. The extra cost of this examination will be \$30-50 depending on your child's level and by enrolling in this program you agree for your child to take part in an examination.

#### **Timetabling and lesson times**

Year 1 to 6 classes are 30minutes in duration and are conducted during school hours on Fridays. To avoid missing the same class, lesson times will vary from week to week rotating on Fridays. Each student is required to bring a plastic display folder to every lesson.

#### Fees for 9 Lessons per Term 3 :

Group of four or more \$206.00

#### Make up lessons

It is the responsibility of the student to attend lessons, however if a student is unable to attend a timetabled lesson, a make- up lesson will be arranged where possible subject to the teacher being notified in advance. (One week's notice is required. Absences without notice will not be made up which is in line with current industrial law whereby the teacher is entitled to a full days' salary once he/she is contracted to teach.)

One school terms written notice is required if enrolment is to be cancelled, or a fee equivalent to 50% of the series charge will be made, unless the withdrawal is on the recommendation of the teacher.
