Next Thursday, **(12 August)** there will be a school closure day to build professional knowledge of the global *Positive Behaviour for Learning SWIS* (School Wide Intervention & Support) data tracking program. This program enables us to identify where and when behaviour incidents (both *major*, such as physical aggression, and *minor* such as misusing equipment) are occurring and why.



Our aim is to take a **proactive** response, rather than a **punitive** 

response and teach and model appropriate, respectful and safe behaviours to our students. Additionally, the SWIS data enables us to track individual student behaviour and support each of our learners to follow school expectations and achieve optimal learning outcomes for themselves and others. From the data collected (SWIS), we aim to be consistent in our approach and implement a clear understanding of our school expectations and the rewards and consequences associated with these.


# **Prep**

One of the Olympic events was rowing. The children (coaches) had to make a boat for their potato athlete. Finally they tested the effectiveness of their designs.














# Year One



# Year 2 Sky

Hello Holy Rosary community

Over the past few months, Year 2 Sky have been hard at work investigating soil. We entered a class project in the science competition, which was led fully by the students. As we had been learning about Earth's resources the students decided to do a natural resource and waste audit of our school grounds to see what we could investigate further. We found many resources, however the students were most interested in our soil quality as they noticed that the plants in our school were growing at different rates even in areas with similar sun. After that they researched, collected soil samples, planted beans and measured the soil to decide on where the healthiest soil in our school is. To make the final decision we looked at the top three samples under the microscope and the students chose to look for the variety of organic matter, the soil colour, insects and the texture of the soil.

# **Speech & Drama lessons 2021**

Speech & Drama lessons are a fun and dynamic way of building students confidence in public speaking, communication and performance skills. Speech & Drama lessons aim to improve diction, improve voice projection and develop natural expression of the spoken word.


