Fees

We understand that the past months have been very challenging and this may have placed a financial strain on some families. We are always happy to assist you and your family should our fees be a financial burden. If you are able to meet the commitment of your fees, this is very much appreciated as we continue to have considerable expenses, including wages without the income generated via fundraising.

Vaccinations for students aged 12 and older

As part of the COVID-19 vaccination rollout, from Monday 13 September, all Victorians aged 12 and older are <u>eligible to book and receive a COVID-19 vaccine</u> at a state vaccination centre, a Commonwealth vaccination centre, or through a GP clinic, pharmacy or community health service.

Vaccination bookings for students should be made by following the instructions on the Coronavirus Victoria website.

Vaccination is not mandatory, but is strongly encouraged. Getting vaccinated is the best way to protect our school community from further outbreaks and the spread of COVID-19.

Gardens

We've just had our trees cut back as part of our regular proactive safety checks, and the gardens have been tended. They look fabulous, especially with the beautiful blue sky backdrop. Spring is such a delightful time!

Hats

With spring comes an increasing UV index. It is fitting that children now wear hats while outside during lunch breaks. If your child is onsite, please ensure your child brings a broad brimmed hat to school and has sunscreen applied at home. Sunscreen is provided at school and can be reapplied prior to play breaks. If your child is working offsite, please look for your child's hat in readiness for our eventual return to school. Hats can be purchased through Noone Uniforms.

PBL (Positive Behaviour for Learning):

'Safety is our right' Staying Safe Online

Our children are doing a terrific job keeping emotionally well and staying connected with friends and family. With the holidays coming up, the children may miss seeing their friends during class Google Meets and some may increase their use of social media including multiplayer games and gaming chat sites. Here's a few conversation items to share with your kids so they're safer online.

- Exclude personal details like phone numbers or date of birth to private profiles
- Do not sign up to social media platforms using your school gmail account as the account clearly identifies your school name and suburb
- Regularly check your privacy and location settings, especially on mobile phones
- Do not use your mobile number to verify accounts
- Keep passwords and log-in details private and don't share these with your friends
- Don't click on pop-ups some pop-ups that seem safe can lead to unsafe sites or ask for personal or financial information
- Accept friend requests only from people you know in person
- When posts are offensive, tell them to stop, leave the chat, block and/or report.

Don't forget that our Holy Rosary User Agreement does not permit students to use school email accounts to sign up to social media apps. This includes Facebook, Instagram, Twitter, Youtube, TikTok, Discord and SnapChat. These apps are aimed at 13+ years. Should your child use their school account to log on to these apps they will have their school email deactivated. It will be reactivated once the teacher has followed this up with you and your child.

Mobile Phones

Holy Rosary's <u>mobile phone policy</u> took effect at the commencement of the 2020 school year. It complies with the direction of the Victorian Minister for Education under Section 5.2.1(2)(b) of the Education and Training Reform Act 2006. The policy requires any student who brings a mobile phone to school to turn it off and hand it into the office each morning. Please remind your child about these expectations if they bring a phone to school.

Class Placement 2022

Early next term we will begin preparing class lists for 2022. This is a comprehensive process that involves staff working collaboratively to consider the best blend of students within a class to ensure academic, social, and wellbeing needs have been considered. Students are involved in the process by nominating other students with whom they work most positively. This may not be a close friend. We make every effort to include one of the students they nominate. However, in helping our students to develop their resilience, it's important that while we set them up for success, we also allow them to stretch themselves by experiencing a range of staff and students throughout their time at Holy Rosary. We use our professional judgement and knowledge of our students to determine these lists and the process is rigorous.

Parents are asked to share only critical information for this process. It should be presented by completing the GoogleForm here. Requests for multiple friends or exclusion from multiple students cannot be accommodated. It is reasonable to request that students are not placed with siblings, cousins, close neighbours and family friends. The final decision for class placement rests with the Leadership Team and information provided by parents may guide a decision but may also be disregarded as we work for the best possible solution for all students. Sometimes parental requests negate requests from other parents, staff or the students themselves. Information from previous years is not considered as children grow, change and mature each year. Friendships and working relationships change too. Therefore, if you believe you have critical information, even if you have submitted this in the past, please submit it again.

Once classes have been finalised they cannot be changed for the reasons outlined. Families are not given an option to choose a class teacher. Our Holy Rosary staff have experience working with students who have a range of academic, social and wellbeing needs. They are supported by highly credentialed leaders in Ant, Sonya and Maria. Information for class placement must be received by Tuesday 12 October, 2021. Late information will not be considered as this will delay our process. Please complete the GoogleForm, only if you have additional information.


MACSIS

Each year, MACS provides the opportunity for students, families and staff to gauge how our school is travelling. This feedback is invaluable to our progress as an effective school community and is backed by evidence based research and best practice. One way that we engage and gather data is via MACSIS - the Melbourne Archdiocese Catholic Schools Improvement Survey. MACSIS has been designed especially for Catholic schools in Melbourne. Teachers will facilitate survey collection of students in Years 4-6. The survey link and accompanying instructions, available in a variety of languages, will be issued randomly to families early next term.




Science News

This week in Science, our students had the choice of a variety of Science lessons as we finished our term with more fun chemistry activities. This term we had lots of lessons around states of matter, solids, liquids and gases, capillary action, as well as chemical reactions and cooking. Next term we will continue our activities on physical chemistry and look at how things move, with the upper year levels focussing on electrical circuits. A big thank you to parents for supporting your children by sourcing materials as needed.









I am excited to announce that our school will be involved in the Great Australian Platypus Search (GAPS) to help save the platypus from extinction. Students from 3/4S and 5/6S and all of the students involved in last year's Maribyrnong River Science Project will be collecting water samples on behalf of our school for the GAPS. They will be joining thousands of other Victorians using innovative technology collecting environmental DNA from local waterways to detect any presence of platypuses. All species leave traces of DNA behind in their environment (we call this environmental DNA, or just eDNA). Using this new technology, we can detect these tiny traces in water samples to infer whether a species is present at a specific site. The GAPS program is applying this eDNA detection technology to systematically investigate the occurrence of platypus over approximately 500,000 km2 of south-eastern Australia. This is an exciting citizen science project for our school to be part of, and we look forward to seeing the results from waterways all across Victoria.

GETTING READY TO ATTEND...





Please ensure children are signed in no later than 9am.



What to wear

During Spring, the mornings can be chilly, so please make sure you bring a warm top (clearly labelled) and keep an eye on the weather so your child is dressed appropriately. Some of our venues are particularly large and take time to warm up on the chillier mornings, so make sure the kids are rugged up. At TeamKids we love to get outside, so please remember to wear suitable footwear for running around.



Double check Teamkids Room Location

It is very important to double check our website prior to attending, in case of a room change. We are sometimes required to temporarily change rooms due to school building maintenance over the school holidays. Last minute changes will be announced via SMS to attending families.



Medical Information? Have a Plan

If your child has Asthma, Anaphylaxis, an Allergy or any other medical condition, upload plans to your TeamKids account and bring along a completed Risk Minimisation Form, found on our website. Please provide required medications to your venue coordinator on the first day of attendance - In their original packaging, clearly labelled with your child's name and a use-by date.

**Please note children are unable to attend our venues without their medication and action plans.



Receiving Child Care Subsidy

After your TeamKids booking is placed, you must log into your MyGov account to check you have a confirmed enrolment.



Extended Hours of operation

During the school holidays, our customer service team are available from 7:00 am till 6:30 pm.



Booking and cancellations

Bookings are subject to availability and may be placed/ amended until 7 am the day of attendance via your Team Kids online account. An additional fee of \$5 per child applies to bookings made inside 7 days of attending. Cancellations must be received before 8 am the day prior to attendance. If inside this time frame, full fee will be charged. Please refer to our website for full cancellation T&C's.



Electronic Sign-In/out

All TeamKids venues require electronic sign in/out. Any person signing your child in or out from TeamKids care MUST be listed on your TeamKids account and know your TeamKids account pin number, if this has been activated. These details can be updated via your TeamKids account at any time.



Pack a Healthy Lunch

A delicious, nutritious, morning and afternoon tea are provided in all programs. Children are required to bring a packed lunch and refillable water bottle.

When packing your child's lunch, please consider that some children in attendance have been diagnosed with food allergies or the risk of anaphylaxis.



Additional Needs

For new families, our TeamKids Inclusion Manager will discuss attendance options for children with additional needs before they attend. Please contact Customer Service on 1300 035 000.

Please note: We require a minimum of four weeks' notice for funding applications for children requiring an extra staff member to help support their time with us. Places cannot be guaranteed if less notice is given.
