Holy Rosary Feast Day: Thursday 21 October



Fun Fact! Our school is named in honour of the Rosary. Holy Rosary, or simply, The Rosary, is a set of prayers or meditation that walks us through the most important times in the life of Jesus and his mother, Mary. We pray different parts of the Rosary, depending on what's happening in our lives at the time. October is the month of the Rosary, so

in a way, it's like celebrating our school's birthday.



Each day, some of the foot traffic on Gower Street takes a detour, to pause outside the Church doors. Over the entrance stands a statue of Mary, accessible to everyone and welcoming all who come to visit her home. They spend time here in quiet prayer before journeying into the rest of their day. Under normal circumstances, the doors are wide open and inside connections between people, our families, our community and God, are strengthened.



This year, the Feast Day of the Holy Rosary is the perfect opportunity for us to create a sheltered space in the protection of the doorway, for those who stop by for prayerful contemplation. We will work together to create a grotto; an image of Mary nestled in a cave of flowers. The children will be making paper flowers with their classes next week and we ask that they contribute to the prayer space on the front doors of the church by sticking their flowers to the grotto, when you pass by during your walk. The area for the flowers will be clearly marked. Remember to bring along sticky tape or a glue stick. The grotto will be ready for contributions on Tuesday 19 October. You may also wish to add a fresh flower to the vase provided. We look forward to uniting in

this unique way with each other and with our community.

Hail Mary, full of grace, the Lord is with you; blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb, Jesus. Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us sinners now and at the hour of our death. Amen.

PBL (Positive Behaviour for Learning)

'Safety is our Right', especially when it comes to using devices.

Here are a few conversation items to share with your kids so they remain online... a friendly reminder as published last term in the Newsletter:

- always exclude personal details like phone numbers or date of birth to private profiles
- **do not** sign up to social media platforms using the school gmail account as the account clearly identifies our school name and suburb
- families are encouraged to regularly check your child's privacy and location settings, especially on mobile phones
- do not use your mobile number to verify accounts
- always keep passwords and log-in details private and don't share these with friends
- don't click on pop-ups some pop-ups which seem safe can lead to unsafe sites or ask for personal or financial information
- accept friend requests only from known people
- if posts are offensive in any way or form, tell the person involved to stop, leave the chat, block and report by telling an adult/parent

Don't forget that our *Holy Rosary User Agreement* does not permit students to use school email accounts to sign up to social media apps, this includes Facebook, Instagram, Twitter, Youtube, TikTok, Discord and SnapChat. These apps are aimed at 13+ years. Should your child use their school account to log on to these apps, they will have their school email deactivated.

Emails will be reactivated once the teacher has followed this up with you and your child.

Winners of the Hugh McKnight Science Talent Search School Award

We are excited to announce the long awaited results from this year's Science Talent Search (STS) competition, a statewide science competition for students in Prep to Year 12. Thanks to our dedicated teachers this year all students in Years One to Six had the opportunity to be involved in a class science project. In total this year we had an impressive 186 of our students involved in individual, group and class projects in the competition. Despite going in and out of lockdown our students managed to produce some incredible projects.





I am very proud to announce that all projects selected to represent our school this year were awarded merit level awards or above, such an incredible achievement. Once again our students' overall success has been recognised with a STS school award. We have been awarded the Hugh McKnight School Award in the independent primary school section, one of only two school awards presented to schools for consistent high quality of entries across the breadth of sections. This year we had students submitting entries in experimental research, creative writing, working models, inventions, computer programming, video production, science photography and games.

Each year STS judges award a number of projects a bursary cheque to recognise the students' high level of scientific understanding. A major bursary is the highest level achievable and usually only awarded to one or two students in each category in the state. We had four awarded to our students! Minor bursaries are awarded to a small number in each category and we had 10 awarded to our students. A huge congratulations to these bursary winners who will receive their certificate, cheque and medal in a virtual ceremony next month.


