Masks

In line with Government protocols, children in Years 3-6 are expected to wear a mask while indoors. Please ensure your child leaves home with a fresh mask each day and carries a spare mask in a snap lock bag, in their school bag. The preference is for cloth masks, rather than disposable masks. Many children are not bringing their own masks to school or carrying a spare mask. Your assistance with this would be greatly appreciated.

School Crossing

Andrew has reported that some of our children are not using the crossing. If your child walks or rides home independently, please have a conversation with them about using the crossing to assist their safety. As adults we are also significant role models for our children and therefore, we ask everyone to lead by example and use the crossing.

Pick up from Hampden Rd

The afternoon pick up commenced on Monday 8 November. There are very few families picking up children from this exit. We will persist with this pick up point until next Friday 19 November. If numbers do not increase we will discontinue this process and notify families in our next newsletter.

Sacraments Update

It's great news that we can resume the celebration of Sacraments this year. In line with COVID safe measures, our Year 3 children will celebrate in two groups during school time on Tuesday November 23 and Thursday November 25. Although parents won't be present on this occasion, it's wonderful that the children will have the opportunity to celebrate with their peers. The teachers will prepare them for this celebration during class time and we will be sure to share photos from the day. First Eucharist and Confirmation details will follow shortly.

PBL (Positive Behaviour for Learning)

For the remainder of this term we will be deepening our understanding of our school expectations:

As a school, we will implement a reward system to acknowledge our success with our whole school Learning Intention: 'We are transitioning from play in a quiet, safe and respectful manner.' Classes will be monitored at the end of each break and the classes which are the most successful will receive a star to add to the School Reward Graph.

Success Criteria

Science News

Last week the 2021 Prime Minister's awards for Science were announced in Canberra. Earlier this year, Holy Rosary parent Rachel Nowak nominated me for the Prime Minister's Award for Science - Primary Teaching. It was an incredible honour to be nominated for such a prestigious award and I thank Rachel for acknowledging my efforts along with all of the other parents, staff and students who wrote heartfelt testimonials as part of the application. It was a huge amount of work for Rachel and I will be forever grateful to her for this opportunity. It was an absolute highlight of my teaching career to read these testimonials and to hear how I have inspired so many students to further their scientific knowledge and encourage a passion for science. I am extremely humbled to say that I made it all the way through the selection process as far as the finals and was shortlisted for the award amongst some extremely talented and inspiring scientists. It was an honour to be considered amongst such a talented field of scientists from across Australia. The awards ceremony celebrated many of the top scientific achievements in Australia during 2021. I have included the link to the ceremony below for anyone interested in hearing from some of Australia's leading scientists and their scientific achievements.

It was a pleasure to hear how Prime Minister Scott Morrison and Minister for Science, Melissa Price, value Australia's many dedicated science educators. At Holy Rosary we are very fortunate to be part of a school with a fabulous specialist program where science is so valued that it is offered as a stand alone subject. The National Science Foundation estimates that 80 percent of the jobs available during the next decade will require maths and science skills. This is why we at Holy Rosary feel it is so important that students are introduced to science education in primary school.

On Monday this week we held this year's virtual Victorian Science Talent Search presentation ceremony where all of the Holy Rosary bursary winners were acknowledged and received their medals and certificates with our students and school receiving more than \$1300 in total prize money! A huge congratulations to all of these students.

Glass: More than meets the eye. Each year the poster and creative writing topics are based around the topic.
