### COVID News

This year's start to the school year is also tinged with some anxiety because of the high number of people testing positive for COVID-19. We can reassure you that we are working hard to implement COVIDSafe measures based on the latest health advice so that everyone in our community remains safe, and our school remains open. When there is a new confirmed case in the school, we will email the class(es) involved. When you receive this notification, you will be advised to monitor your children for symptoms. There is no need to stay home from school. At the end of the day, we will send a generic email to all parents identifying any new confirmed cases. The key message for all staff and families is to constantly monitor for symptoms and to test your children twice weekly.

### Rapid Antigen Tests

The Department of Health is strongly recommending that students complete a test twice a week to help proactively identify any cases, reducing the risks of an outbreak. If you have yet to receive your test, you may collect it this afternoon from the table set up in the yard or from the office tomorrow or Friday. Further tests will be issued in Week 3 when they have been delivered.

Please report a COVID-positive result to:

- the school by phone or the [VicEd COVID Portal](#); this is so that we can support students, record that they will be absent while in 7-day isolation, and let the rest of the school community know there has been a positive case onsite and that they should monitor for symptoms
- the Department of Health via the [COVID-19 Positive Rapid Antigen Test Self-Reporting Form](#) or call centre on 1800 675 398.

### **Vaccination requirements**

Parents and carers must have had two doses of a COVID-19 vaccine or have a valid medical exception (with limited exceptions) to enter school buildings.

COVID-19 vaccinations for students are not required for them to attend school but vaccination for students is highly encouraged. If your child has not yet had their first dose, please try to organise this. ### **Parents on School Grounds**

Parents are able to be on school grounds as long as they remain physically distanced. You no longer need to check in while on the grounds. However, if you need to enter the building you must check in and show your vaccination certificate at the office.

### **Pick Up Hampden Rd**

Hampden Rd has been implemented as a pick up zone to reduce parents gathering at the gate and church. It is available for students in Years 1-6. We will reassess the viability of this zone at the end of next week.

### **Masks letter from parents**

The government requirement is for students in Years 3-6 to wear a mask indoors while P-2 students are encouraged to wear a mask. If your child has an exemption, please put this in writing to [frontoffice@hrkensington.catholic.edu.au](mailto:frontoffice@hrkensington.catholic.edu.au). Students in 3-6 are asked to carry a spare mask in a snaplock bag.

This [podcast](#) from Royal Children's Hospital may be helpful listening for families. The most recent episode focuses on our children's return to face to face learning and how families can manage some of the anxiety children may be facing.

Here's some helpful tips to help your child when they are having trouble separating from you at the front gate.

1. Ensure the family is organised for school the night before so that the getting ready for school time is calm and not rushed.
2. Plan some quiet parent child time in the morning to have a cuddle in bed, a chat over breakfast, a walk together or share a story.
3. Prepare your child for school time by giving them advance warning, "We'll leave for school in ten minutes."
4. At the gate, tell them you'll be back to pick them up at 3:20pm and where you will meet them. Then give them one kiss, one hug and leave. If you need support from staff, please let us know and then leave. This can be challenging for you but in teachers' experience it's the best way for us to help your child.
5. You are welcome to call the office later to check that your child has calmed down.

## Changes to online safety

The [Online Safety Act 2021](#) (Cth) commenced on 23 January 2022 and delivers new and strengthened schemes to keep Australians safe online, including mechanisms to remove seriously abusive and harmful content.

## Child cyberbullying

eSafety administers a complaints service for Australian children who experience serious cyberbullying. Under the scheme, eSafety can investigate complaints about serious cyberbullying material targeting an Australian child and request its removal. eSafety can request content be taken down from the full range of online services, for example social media platforms, games, websites and messaging services.

## PBL (Positive Behaviour for Learning)

Our present focus is to support our students to transition quickly and quietly from the playground to their classroom and ensure that movement in the corridors follows our school expectation, 'Keep Left, Keep Quiet.'

This year we will collect data which will assist us to implement the most successful strategies for our students. Our first meeting with Jane will take place next week.


Your conversation with your child regarding the school's three expectations would support our endeavours in PBL.
