Fourth Week of Lent

(Week beginning Monday 28th March)

This week through Project Compassion we learn about Rosalie, who lives with her husband and seven children in the Democratic Republic of Congo. Forced to join the army when she was just 15-years-old, Rosalie experienced significant trauma and hardship during her years in the military. After she was demobilised from the army, Rosalie, like other ex-combatants, was left to fend for herself in the community.

With your generous support and through Caritas Australia's partners, the Catholic Agency for Overseas Development (CAFOD) and Caritas Bukavu, Rosalie was able to connect with other members of her community and participate in business skills training to help her to reintegrate into society.

She joined a savings group which helped her with a loan to start her own small business selling second-hand shoes and natural remedies.

"I can eat, dress, maintain my health and help others. My children study and manage to eat twice a day. I have learnt to work hand-in-hand with other members of the community. Really, there is more joy in sharing with others." - Rosalie

Holy Rosary has four house teams and all students are assigned to a different colour. Each house team is named after a significant person of faith in the history of Holy Rosary School. Our students have a reputation for their support and encouragement of each other at sport, and we strongly promote this.

This Friday, all students are asked to attend school in their house colours as a way to help them to identify with their House Team and develop greater team spirit. In the morning, students in Year 3-6 will participate in a **compulsory** training session at JJ Holland Park.

Our House Teams

McAuley

Our red house team is McAuley. It's named after Catherine McAuley, the Irish lady who started the Sisters of Mercy. She needed the Sisters to help her to teach the poor and nurse the sick. Catherine inspired the work of the Mercy Sisters who opened Holy Rosary School. Catherine said, "We should be shining lamps giving light to those around us." These words inspired our school song and we continue to wear the Mercy Cross on our uniform. The very first principal of HR was Sister Clare Daly who began in 1916.

Sion

Sion House, our green team, is named after the Sisters of Sion who were at Holy Rosary for a period of time. The Sisters started their work teaching in France and they first came to Australia in 1890. The Sisters of Sion define themselves as "women who help to heal a fractured world". They are well known for instilling a tradition of welcome and inclusion; important values for us at HR.

MacKillop

MacKillop House is our blue team, and it reminds us of Mary MacKillop. Mary was born in Melbourne and was baptised at St Francis Church in the city. She had a calling from God to teach the poorest and most remote children in Australia. To help her important work, Mary established the Sisters of St Joseph, often called the Joeys. Mary became famous for her words, "Never see a need without doing something about it." Her words remind us all to take action to help those who need us. Mary's work was very challenging and she inspires us to be resilient and to act with integrity, even when things are very tough. Mary of the Cross MacKillop became Australia's first saint.

Hennessy

Our yellow house team is Hennessy, in honour of Holy Rosary's first Parish Priest, Father Aeneas Francis Hennessy who was born in 1860. Holy Rosary Church was first opened in Derby St in 1902 but it didn't become a Parish until 1915. That's when Father Hennessy left Lilydale and became Holy Rosary's first Parish Priest. He lived in Derby Street and moved to Gower Street in 1919. The church was later demolished, and a new church opened, where it is now, in Gower Street in 1928. Fr Hennessy died in 1932 and is buried at the Melbourne Cemetery.

Class Hosts- Please nominate!

In the interest of continual improvement and renewal, the SAC investigated ways that parents may like to be engaged in school life. As a result of discussions, we are pleased to introduce the role of Class Hosts. You'll find a role description in this newsletter which also explains the application process. We welcome you to act now, so that we can announce Class Hosts early in Term 2. From 2023 onwards, Class Hosts will be appointed at the beginning of the school year.

Please carefully read the Operoo notices sent out to you. We are working to keep all our excursion/incursion/camp notifications on the one platform but we need your support. The activities we provide are an important part of our curriculum and community, and are therefore compulsory. All students should participate in these, unless there is a valid medical exception.

Only give this permission if your child is confident, capable and willing to run this distance. Otherwise, decline the invitation.

Science updates


There's so much happening in the lead up to the end of Term 1!

Victorian Premiers' Reading Challenge



The Victorian Premiers' Reading Challenge is now open and Holy Rosary School is excited to be participating. The PRC application <https://vprc.eduweb.vic.gov.au/home> offers a range of exciting features including:

- access to a library catalogue (including book images and blurbs)
- a modern user-friendly interface
- rewarding students with badges as challenge milestones are achieved
- the option for students to mark books as a favourite, give them a star rating or complete a book review

The Challenge is open to all Victorian children from birth to Year 10 in recognition of the importance of reading for literacy development. It is not a competition; but a personal challenge for children to read a set number of books by 2 September 2022.

Children from Prep to Year 2 are encouraged to read or 'experience' 30 books with their parents and teachers. Children from Year 3 to Year 10 are challenged to read 15 books.

All children who meet the Challenge will receive a certificate of achievement signed by the Victorian Premier and former Premiers.

Children will receive their login details from their classroom teacher.

Class Hosts

“Without judgement, Catholic schools remain in communication with each family, tailoring the means of this dialogue so no child or family is disadvantaged...The dialogue is open and honest, and the trust and communication between the school and the family is focused on honouring the dignity of the family, the school and most importantly, of the child, ‘so they may develop as optimistic, resilient young people of faith, ready to be effective members of community, contributing to and enriching the world around them.” Horizon’s of Hope, MACS (2018).

Holy Rosary School welcomes parents to work in partnership through the initiative of Class Hosts. This integral group of parent volunteers will actively participate in a range of social and educational activities to support the values, aims and vision of the school.

Fundamentally, Class Hosts organise a variety of events, initiatives, and work at the grassroots level to support classroom teachers and children throughout the school year. These include year level events and activities for their children’s respective year levels, and support of school events, including parent education sessions.

Therefore, the role of *Class Hosts* is to work with teachers to support the school in various ways:

- meet at the beginning of each school year to decide on the goals as Class Hosts
- join and work alongside the Social and Fundraising Group and be actively involved in their initiatives, activities and goals, and encourage other parents to participate in fundraising events
- promote the school within the wider community
- regularly communicate with classroom teachers to support endeavours in the classroom such as gathering parents to complete tasks as required by the teacher and level teachers
- provide suggestions for the newsletter and social media posts
- support the teacher with disseminating and promoting information from the school to the parent community
- welcome new families by introducing them to the parent community
- reach out to the families where English is their second language to assist their needs
- coordinate/assist with crisis support for families
- invite/promote social events for families including parent only functions of the class or year level
- assist with official parent gatherings eg. Prep 1st day of school cuppa, Year 6 Graduation dinner, plates etc.
- provide a means for parents to contribute to the development of the school’s policies and practices where required
- communicate ideas to SAC members for discussion at meetings

Process

Parents nominate themselves as the Class Host at the beginning of the school year (however, by the end of Term 1 for the 2022 school year) by sending an expression of interest to the SAC email address hrsac@hrkensington.catholic.edu.au. A document will be created listing all interested parents. A meeting will be convened by the principal and a SAC member where responsibilities and the scope of Class Hosts are outlined.


What happens when no one from a grade nominates/ more than one parent nominates?

In the event that a Class Host is not assigned to a particular grade, the teacher will approach their parents and ask for a volunteer.

Parents should only nominate for one year level to give all parents an equal opportunity.

If more than one parent nominates, the group will work together. If there are more than 3 parents (for example) SAC members can coordinate a group meeting to ensure that all members are happy to be included and understand their expectations.

What to wear

During Autumn, the mornings can be chilly, so please make sure you bring a warm top (clearly labelled) and keep an eye on the weather so your child is dressed appropriately. Some of our venues are particularly large and take time to warm up on the chillier mornings, so make sure the kids are rugged up. At TeamKids we love to get outside, so please remember to wear suitable footwear for running around.



Double check TeamKids Room Location

It is very important to double check our website prior to attending, in case of a room change. We are sometimes required to temporarily change rooms due to school building maintenance over the school holidays. Last minute changes will be announced via SMS to attending families.



Medical Information? Have a Plan

If your child has Asthma, Anaphylaxis, an Allergy or any other medical condition, upload plans to your TeamKids account and bring along a completed Risk Minimisation Form, found on our website. Please provide required medications to your venue coordinator on the first day of attendance - In their original packaging, clearly labelled with your child's name and a use-by date.

Receiving child care Subsidy

After your TeamKids booking is placed, you must log into your MyGov account to check you have a confirmed enrolment.



Extended Hours of operation

During the school holidays, our customer service team are available from 7:00 am till 6:30 pm.



Booking and Cancellations

Bookings are subject to availability and may be placed/amended until 6.30am the day of attendance via your TeamKids online account. An additional fee of \$5 per child applies to bookings made inside 7 days of attending. Cancellations must be received 48hrs prior to attendance. If inside this time frame, full fee will be charged. Please refer to our website and your fully booked account for full cancellation T&C's.



Electronic Sign-in/out

All TeamKids venues require electronic sign in/out. Any person signing your child in or out from TeamKids care MUST be listed on your TeamKids account and know your TeamKids account pin number, if this has been activated. These details can be updated via your TeamKids account at any time.



Pack a Healthy Lunch

A delicious, nutritious, morning and afternoon tea are provided in all programs. Children are required to bring a packed lunch and refillable water bottle.

When packing your child's lunch, please consider that some children in attendance have been diagnosed with food allergies or the risk of anaphylaxis.



Additional Needs

Speech & Drama lessons are a fun and dynamic way of building students confidence in public speaking, communication and performance skills. Speech & Drama lessons aim to improve diction, improve voice projection and develop natural expression of the spoken word.

The course will include skills such as vocal exercises, storytelling, improvisation, presentation skills and drama. Fun relaxed examinations will be undertaken as part of this program in November of each year. The extra cost of this examination will be \$30-50 depending on your child's level and by enrolling in this program you agree for your child to take part in an examination.

Timetabling and lesson times

Year 1 to 6 classes are 30minutes in duration and are conducted during school hours on Fridays. To avoid missing the same class, lesson times will vary from week to week rotating on Fridays.

Each student is required to bring a plastic display folder to every lesson.
