COVID Update

We have been advised that we will be provided with RAT tests for students and staff for the remainder of the term. However, from Monday 23 May 2022, children are not required to test twice weekly as previously advised. RATs are still required by those who are household contacts to attend school (five negative tests over a seven-day period) or those who have symptoms. You should continue to notify the Department of Health and our office if your child returns a positive RAT result or they are household contacts. Vaccination continues to remain the best way to protect students. Getting vaccinated is easy and bookings can be done via the Department of Health's website <https://portal.cvms.vic.gov.au>. If you have any questions about the vaccines, speak to your GP.

Student and Staff Illness

As predicted, the community is experiencing high levels of illness and winter hasn't even begun yet! We ask for your assistance in two ways; please do not send your child to school if they complain of being unwell and please come promptly when we call you to collect your child. Our sick bay has a revolving door! Children need to be home when they are sick and we need to reduce the spread of germs.

Finding replacement staff continues to be a significant issue. There are times when Leadership Team members are needed to teach, as we cannot source relief teachers from our pool. Please be understanding that at this time, our response to your emails may be delayed. We are facing an extreme staff shortage across Australia and the ongoing illness definitely adds to this challenge.

Staff Professional Learning

There are a multitude of ways that staff engage in ongoing professional learning at Holy Rosary. One of the most powerful ways that teachers learn is from one another. With this in mind, each Wednesday afternoon our teachers engage in Professional Learning Communities focussing on Mathematics and English. These are facilitated by Maria Sedunary in her role as Learning and Teaching Leader, and Sarah as Mathematics Leader.

After ongoing learning, planning and direction from Maria, our Year 1 teachers, Emily and Jenna, have introduced a very successful writing program with their classes. Last week, we learnt about the stages in the writing process, thanks to Emily who keenly shared their successful strategies with Prep-Two teachers. Maria, Jenna and Emily's passion and enthusiasm is contagious and the Prep-Two teachers were buzzing with wonderful ideas to further enhance writing in our junior classes.



School Closure- Positive Behaviour for Learning

We are taking collegial learning a step further this Monday. Holy Rosary Staff will participate in ongoing professional learning, with our coach Jane Bennett from MACS. However, this time we have also initiated collegial learning from St Francis Xavier School in Corio. We are very excited to learn about the PBL journey Maria Scala and her team at SFX have undertaken and we thank them for their generous offer to allow us to learn and work with them for the day.

Please note that this day involves all staff and therefore, Holy Rosary School will be closed apart from [TeamKids](#) which will operate from 7am-6pm.



Treating Sports Equipment respectfully

At Holy Rosary, each class has a sports tub that has a variety of equipment for all students to use. We top this tub up at the beginning of each school year. The classes who care for the equipment and use it in the manner for which it is intended have a greater supply of equipment that is in better condition. Recently, we have noticed two undesirable behaviours; using the equipment in unintended ways and taking equipment without permission from the PE cupboard or other class tubs. This lesson is intended to explain the expectations of students with school sports equipment.

Class Hosts

“Without judgement, Catholic schools remain in communication with each family, tailoring the means of this dialogue so no child or family is disadvantaged...The dialogue is open and honest, and the trust and communication between the school and the family is focused on honouring the dignity of the family, the school and most importantly, of the child, ‘so they may develop as optimistic, resilient young people of faith, ready to be effective members of community, contributing to and enriching the world around them.” Horizon’s of Hope, MACS (2018).

Holy Rosary School welcomes parents to work in partnership through the initiative of Class Hosts. This integral group of parent volunteers will actively participate in a range of social and educational activities to support the values, aims and vision of the school.

Fundamentally, Class Hosts organise a variety of events, initiatives, and work at the grassroots level to support classroom teachers and children throughout the school year. These include year level events and activities for their children’s respective year levels, and support of school events, including parent education sessions.

Therefore, the role of *Class Hosts* is to work with teachers to support the school in various ways:

- meet at the beginning of each school year to decide on the goals as Class Hosts
- join and work alongside the Social and Fundraising Group and be actively involved in their initiatives, activities and goals, and encourage other parents to participate in fundraising events
- promote the school within the wider community
- regularly communicate with classroom teachers to support endeavours in the classroom such as gathering parents to complete tasks as required by the teacher and level teachers
- provide suggestions for the newsletter and social media posts
- support the teacher with disseminating and promoting information from the school to the parent community
- welcome new families by introducing them to the parent community
- reach out to the families where English is their second language to assist their needs
- coordinate/assist with crisis support for families
- invite/promote social events for families including parent only functions of the class or year level
- assist with official parent gatherings eg. Prep 1st day of school cuppa, Year 6 Graduation dinner, plates etc.
- provide a means for parents to contribute to the development of the school’s policies and practices where required
- communicate ideas to SAC members for discussion at meetings

Process

Parents nominate themselves as the Class Host at the beginning of each school year (however, by the end of Term 1 for the 2022 school year) by sending an expression of interest to the SAC email address.

hrsac@hrkensington.catholic.edu.au. A document will be created listing all interested parents. A meeting will be convened by the principal and a SAC member where responsibilities and the scope of Class Hosts are outlined.

What happens when no one from a grade nominates/ more than one parent nominates?

In the event that a Class Host is not assigned to a particular grade, the teacher will approach their parents and ask for a volunteer.

Parents should only nominate for one year level to give all parents an equal opportunity.

If more than one parent nominates, the group will work together. If there are more than 3 parents (for example) SAC members can coordinate a group meeting to ensure that all members are happy to be included and understand their expectations.


