Ruth graciously stepped up and took on the organisational aspects of the program. We thank Fr Thang and Fr Peter for their gentle and calm manner which allowed the children to celebrate with such joy. Our Holy Rosary staff are also recognised for their attendance over both evenings to show their support of your children.



Illness

There are so many illnesses circulating at the moment; COVID, gastro and influenza are the primary ones. Please keep sick children at home to help us contain the spread of illness. It is critical that we all keep well. Although we have had minimal staff off work in comparison to other schools, it is increasingly difficult to replace them, especially when the time absent is usually five school days. With the significant time lost in 2020 and 2021 we are all keen to continue this important work to improve the behaviour, wellbeing and learning of all children at Holy Rosary.

Positive Behaviour for Learning (PBL)

Our focus is to ensure Holy Rosary provides an environment that promotes optimal learning and teaching for all students and staff. Therefore, we follow the Positive Behaviour for Learning model. This model encompasses our three school expectations; Safety is our Right, Learning is our Responsibility, Respect is our Way.

Beginning last Friday, we have been focussing on our Friday canteen. We noticed that children were not lining up in ways that reflect our expectations, and that manners were inconsistent. We introduced 'Jump the Queue' at the canteen with great success. 'Jump the Queue' is to reward those children who follow the expectations when lining up. We noticed that children were very keen to modify their behaviour to allow them to 'Jump the Queue' and receive express service.

Our PBL lessons focus on establishing new protocols that reflect a safe and calm environment for students, staff and volunteers. An excerpt of our teaching program is included so that you may reiterate points with your children and support our work.



Dear parents, guardians and carers

Re: Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD)

Every year, all schools in Australia participate in the Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD). The NCCD process requires schools to identify information already available in the school about support provided to students with disabilities. These relate to legislative requirements under the *Disability Discrimination Act 1992* and the *Disability Standards for Education 2005*, in line with the *NCCD guidelines* (2019). Information provided about students to the Australian Government for the NCCD includes:

- year of schooling
- category of disability: physical, cognitive, sensory or social/emotional
- level of adjustment provided: support provided within quality differentiated teaching practice, supplementary, substantial or extensive.

This information assists schools to:

- formally recognise the supports and adjustments provided to students with disability in schools
- consider how they can strengthen the support of students with disability in schools
- develop shared practices so that they can review their learning programs in order to improve educational outcomes for students with disability.

The NCCD provides state and federal governments with the information they need to plan more broadly for the support of students with disabilities.

The NCCD will have no direct impact on your child and your child will not be involved in any testing process. The school will provide data to the Australian Government in such a way that no individual student will be able to be identified – the privacy and confidentiality of all students is ensured. All information is protected by privacy laws that regulate the collection, storage and disclosure of personal information. 
