

Dear Parents and Friends of Holy Rosary



This year we have committed to providing teachers with ongoing professional learning in English and Mathematics. As part of this, classroom teachers are meeting with our curriculum leaders, Maria and Sarah today or tomorrow to plan for their teaching in these subjects for Term 3.

Teachers have expressed their appreciation for these learning opportunities and the positive impact these sessions have had on their teaching, and on student learning.

After School

Teachers come out to the yard each afternoon to be available to chat to parents. They welcome you to say hello at that time, ask questions or to organise a time for a meeting. You may notice on Wednesdays and Thursdays that they leave the yard more promptly. This is because they are expected to be in staff meetings at 3:40pm. These meetings focus on professional learning related to our school goals, particularly in English, Mathematics, PBL and Religion, as well as attending to the administrative requirements of teachers and schools. Over the past two weeks all staff upgraded their First Aid certificates.

Winter Warmer Day

Next Tuesday 21 July thanks to a wonderful team of parent helpers we will host our first 'Winter Warmer Day,' just for fun. The children will enjoy pies, sausage rolls and 'hot' chocolate for lunch. They may dress in their winter woollies; a scarf, beanie, mittens, and slippers for inside. This is **not** a casual clothes day, and correct uniform and shoes must still be worn.

Positive Behaviour for Learning

Our purpose in implementing PBL at Holy Rosary School is to ensure

1. *school-wide consistency of behaviour and expectations, improved social skills and academic performance.*
2. *every child has the right to learn and every teacher has the right to teach.*

Following our school closure day at St Francis Xavier School, Corio we came back to school re-inspired and reinvigorated in our PBL journey, excited by the wonderful work we had observed in action. We have been using the feedback from staff and parents to inform our weekly lessons and all classes have been participating in these lessons each Monday. The idea of this is to ensure consistency of our messaging across the school from Prep-Year 6. Our focus on the canteen is an example of improved behaviour as a result of consistent whole staff expectations. On Friday, there were positive reports about the safe and respectful way children behaved while waiting to be served.

This week, we are again focussing on a school routine; the way we transition from playground to classroom when an extreme weather program is called in the middle of a play break. We expect the children to move to classrooms in ways that demonstrate that 'Safety is our Right' at Holy Rosary.

Holy Rosary Positive Behaviours for Learning

Lesson Plan for **Extreme Weather** when transitioning from the yard.

Step 1: List the skills/rules for this Expectation in this Location from The Holy Rosary Expectation Matrix

When an Extreme Weather Program is called, students and staff can safely move from the yard to their classrooms.

Step 2: List a rationale for teaching the behaviour Why is it important?

Walking safely back into our classrooms keeps us safe and dry.

Step 3: Identify examples and non-examples of the desired behaviour

**What would the behaviour look/sound like?
What would the behaviour not look/sound like?**

Examples	Non-examples
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Stop playing once an announcement has been made • Listen for any further announcements • Walk calmly and quietly to the door your class normally walks through • Follow instructions given • Keep left and keep quiet - observe 'Walking Zones' • Wait in front of your classroom for your teacher • Ask permission from the teacher before taking/using resources/games • Go to the toilet before the second bell throughout lunchtime. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Continue to play after an announcement has been made • Scream, run, push or dance in the rain • Run and push to get through the door or when in the corridors • Don't wait for a teacher to let you into the building • Go into the classroom when my teacher is not there • Move through the school in an unsafe way • Yell to your friends to hurry up • Talk loudly to your friends • Bunch up on the stairs • Enter the school using a different door than your class usually enters • Take resources out of cupboards without teacher approval • Use devices • Play in the corridor unsupervised • Play unsafely in the classroom • Wait till the second bell or afterwards to go the toilet

Step 5: Provide opportunities for practise

- Take the class outside, students imagine they're playing and an announcement has been made that we need to go inside due to extreme weather.
- Students wait calmly and quietly by the door that they usually go in through until a teacher arrives.
- Listen to the teacher as they take turns to make their way into the building.
- Students follow examples discussed in lessons and expectations to follow.
- Students wait outside the classroom in a calm, quiet line until the teacher arrives.

Some new staff members have joined our PBL Team for this second semester and we thank them for their commitment to our ongoing work in PBL. Our team consists of Grace (LSO representative), Vicky (Yr 3/4), Samantha (Yr 2), Maria (LT), Ant (LT), Chris (LT) and Emily (Yr 1). We thank Jenna for the extraordinary work she has given to the team since its inception. Yesterday, we had a most productive day responding to staff input to revise our purpose, Behaviour Matrix, definitions of major and minor behaviours and a flow chart for staff when behaviours occur either on the yard or in classrooms. This information will be presented to staff in the first week of Term 3 and then shared with families.

Interviews. Parent Teacher Interviews are an opportunity for teachers and parents to meet to discuss your child's progress and their report, and to celebrate their achievements. If you have not booked an appointment yet please do so by Sunday 6pm. Further instructions are provided.

At 12:00 the Leadership Team will be on duty to supervise children on the yard while teachers have a quick lunch break before interviews commence. All teachers will have a tight schedule on this day and therefore, we ask you to check your interview time and arrive at school punctually to ensure you make the most of your allotted time for conversation. If you are unwell on the day, please email your child's teacher and an online interview will be arranged either on this day or at another time before or after school.

What to wear

During Winter, the mornings can be chilly, so please make sure you bring a warm top (clearly labelled) and keep an eye on the weather so your child is dressed appropriately. Some of our venues are particularly large and take time to warm up on the chillier mornings, so make sure the kids are rugged up. At TeamKids we love to get outside, so please remember to wear suitable footwear for running around.



Pack a Healthy Lunch

A delicious, nutritious, morning and afternoon tea are provided in all programs. Children are required to bring a packed lunch and refillable water bottle.

When packing your child's lunch, please consider that some children in attendance have been diagnosed with food allergies or the risk of anaphylaxis.



Medical Information? Have a Plan

If your child has Asthma, Anaphylaxis, an Allergy or any other medical condition, upload plans to your TeamKids account and bring along a completed Risk Minimisation Form, found on our website. Please provide required medications to your venue coordinator on the first day of attendance - In their original packaging, clearly labelled with your child's name and a use-by date.

**Please note children are unable to attend our venues without their medication and action plans.



Receiving child care Subsidy

After your TeamKids booking is placed, you must log into your MyGov account to check you have a confirmed enrolment.



Extended Hours of operation

During the school holidays, our customer service team are available from 7:00 am till 6:30 pm.



Booking and Cancellations

Bookings are subject to availability and may be placed/ amended until the start of the session via your TeamKids online account. An additional fee of \$5 per child applies to bookings made within 7 days of attending.

Cancellations made within 48 hours of the session commencing will incur the normal fee and will be charged accordingly. Cancellations made with more than 48 hours' notice will not be charged. In the event of a medical illness, please email a medical certificate to info@teamkids.com.au WITHIN 48 HOURS of the absence to avoid being charged for the booking. Please refer to our website for full cancellation T&C's.



Electronic Sign-In/out

All TeamKids venues require electronic sign in/out. Any person signing your child in or out from TeamKids care MUST be listed on your TeamKids account and know your TeamKids account pin number, if this has been activated. These details can be updated via your TeamKids account at any time.



Double check TeamKids Room Location

It is very important to double check our website prior to attending, in case of a room change. We are sometimes required to temporarily change rooms due to school building maintenance over the school holidays. Last minute changes will be announced via SMS to attending families.

NOTIFICATION OF WORKS

Road Resurfacing Works at Bellair Street, Kensington

Citywide, on behalf of City of Melbourne, are about to commence construction which may impact you.

Where: Bellair Street, between Macaulay Rd and Wight Lane.

When: Monday 20th June 2022. 7am - 5pm, weather permitting. Traffic and parking changes will occur up to 24 hours prior to the commencement of the works.

Why: To upgrade the road surface for better functionality and aesthetics

What we are doing: Road surface will be profiled and then resurfaced with hot mix asphalt for part of Bellair St, North Bound Only. Followed by Linemarking reinstatement which will be undertaken at night.

How could this impact you?

While we continue to make every effort to minimise disruption and inconvenience to you, the following can be expected;

- There will be construction noise and some dust from machinery and construction vehicles for periods of time during the working hours.
- Full road closure will be in place during works. Traffic controllers will be on site to ensure that non- traffic does not enter while works are underway.
- Residential vehicle access may be impacted for brief periods (liaise with traffic controllers if required) and detours will be in place.
- Footpath access will be maintained at all times
- Public access to shops will be maintained for all traders.
- Parking signs will be changed within 24 hours prior to construction work starting to ensure

the area is clear for the necessary works to be undertaken.

- The temporary parking signs will state 'reserved parking permit holders excepted' and the signs will look like this:



- A reserved parking permit is a special permit issued during construction on occasion. **Please note that standard resident or other parking permits cannot be used.** Any vehicles parked in the area that do not have a reserved parking permit displayed after the parking signs have been changed may be issued an infringement notice.
