To sleep deeply and gently at one with the heart.


To dream with the heart.

Illness



If your children are ill, we ask that you keep them at home. Not only will this help with the spread of the various illnesses circulating around our community at the moment, but it gives everyone the fighting chance to recover quickly. We have sent home an average of 3 children a day over the past few weeks.

Late arrivals

Over the past 2 weeks, we have noticed that the number of children arriving late at school is rising, infact, we had a record 42 late arrivals on Monday. We understand that occasionally this can't be helped. however, it is extremely disruptive to learning when children are late. This is not only for the latecomer, but for the children already in the classroom. When children are late, they must check in on the iPad in the office. This practice is a safety measure as we need to know who is onsite at all times.



Safety is paramount to us so it is important that parents notify the school of an absence or late arrival (via SkoolBag App or by calling and leaving a message) before school starts. This will save you receiving a text message. It also means that our records can be completed close to 9am.

If you receive a text from the office asking you to confirm your child's absence (or late arrival) from school, please call back as soon as possible. It helps us keep accurate records of the comings and goings of children. School phone number: 9376 9455

Holy Rosary students have outdone themselves this year with more than 100 students entering projects into this year's Science Fair. Classrooms have been a buzz over the last couple of weeks as students proudly shared their projects and new found knowledge. These students became the experts in their area of science, teaching their classmates (and sometimes their teachers) new and interesting information! The amount of time and effort these students have put into their projects, researching, designing, constructing and presenting their work is to be commended. We have seen models, games, picture story books, posters, videos, computer programs, experiments, photography and more. This year has seen the computer program category gain popularity with more students designing and constructing their own computer programs than ever before.

We have seen topics such as Does Toothpaste Really Work? If I drop a Glass, which is the best floor covering to stop it breaking? Do Mozzies Like a Latte? We have also seen models of The Eye, The Brain and even Black Holes!

PBL: This week's lesson focused on walking around the school.

Holy Rosary Positive Behaviours for Learning

Lesson Plan for Safety is Our Right inside buildings and on the school grounds

Step 1: List Learning Intentions and Success Criteria

LI: We are learning to move through the school in a quiet, safe and respectful manner.

I can walk, keeping left and keeping quiet when I am moving through the school including when I need to go to the office I can walk down the stairs and use the railing appropriately at all times

I can walk to the playground at bell times and secure a place to play in a safe manner

I can walk to my line safely at the end of play breaks

I can walk from my classroom to the playground at break times, including the end of the day

Step 2: List a rationale for teaching the behaviour

Why is it important?

We all have the right to feel safe and be safe. Walking eliminates to a large extent, accidents that occur at busy times like bell times. Walking in and around the school buildings keeps us all safe. It allows teachers to concentrate on the business of teaching and children on the business of learning.

Step 3: Identify examples and non-examples of the desired behaviour

What would the behaviour look/sound like? What would the behaviour not look/sound like? Examples Non-examples

- bell signals the beginning of a break time, walk safely from classrooms, through the corridors and onto the playground - teacher to supervise/accompany class
- running only on the green turf outside the office/Yard 2/senior yard
- doors leading out to the playground from the Mercy Hall is a Walking Zone
 Old cubby house area is a walking zone
 Welcome Place is a walking zone/quiet area
- stop games (as per usual) at the end of play on the first bell and walk to class lines
- walk on the ramp leading down to (or up from) the bottom yard at all times
- walk quietly through the school and down to the office.
- walk to collect notices and office tubs each day quietly and keeping left
- follow the "walking zones" around the school signified by walking symbol
- use a line up order as specified by the teacher eg alphabetical order

- running down the stairs at the beginning of play/break
- running to deliver notices to the office
- running to the class line at the end of play/break
- running into the building at the end of play/break
- overtaking on the stairs
- jumping stairs
- running through the corridors at the beginning of play leading out to the playground
- pushing others once in the lineup area
- walking and talking in lines
- running down the path leading (up or down) to the Adventure Playground
 - running on the play equipment in the Adventure Playground

Step 4: Practice/Role Play Activities Model expected behaviour (I do):

Discuss why it's important to walk around our school - confined space and most accidents occur at bell times Revist and practise expectations of walking around the school - what will I see/hear

Lead students through behaviour (We do):

Practise walking around the school/walking at specified 'Walking Zone' areas

- walking to class lines on the bell at the end of play/break
- walking from playground to classrooms and vise versa, in two lines/quietly
- walking through the corridors in single file lines to specialist classes/library
- walking in two lines at the end of the day to the dismissal area (teacher to supervise this)

Reinforce/praise/reward children who follow the expectations and procedures

Test to ensure students understand behaviour (You do):

- children show their learning through the day at the appropriate times
- award Dojo points to children who show the correct procedures
- send names to the office of children who walk and stay safe
 (special awards will be given to these children and names will be published in the newsletter)

Step 5: Provide opportunities for practise

- teachers to identify and highlight children for their appropriate behaviour
- lesson to be taught on MONDAY morning before the first play/break
- teachers should practise/re-teach and review this routine frequently



GETTING READY TO ATTEND...



Please ensure children are signed in no later than 9am.



What to wear

During Winter, the mornings can be chilly, so please make sure you bring a warm top (clearly labelled) and keep an eye on the weather so your child is dressed appropriately. Some of our venues are particularly large and take time to warm up on the chillier mornings, so make sure the kids are rugged up. At TeamKids we love to get outside, so please remember to wear suitable footwear for running around.



Pack a Healthy Lunch

A delicious, nutritious, morning and afternoon tea are provided in all programs. Children are required to bring a packed lunch and refillable water bottle.

When packing your child's lunch, please consider that some children in attendance have been diagnosed with food allergies or the risk of anaphylaxis.



Medical Information? Have a Plan

If your child has Asthma, Anaphylaxis, an Allergy or any other medical condition, upload plans to your TeamKids account and bring along a completed Risk Minimisation Form, found on our website. Please provide required medications to your venue coordinator on the first day of attendance - In their original packaging, clearly labelled with your child's name and a use-by date.

**Please note children are unable to attend our venues without their medication and action plans.



Receiving child care Subsidy

After your TeamKids booking is placed, you must log into your MyGov account to check you have a confirmed enrolment.



Extended Hours of operation

During the school holidays, our customer service team are available from 7:00 am till 6:30 pm.



Booking and cancellations

Bookings are subject to availability and may be placed/ amended until the start of the session via your TeamKids online account. An additional fee of \$5 per child applies to bookings made within 7 days of attending.

Cancellations made within 48 hours of the session commencing will incur the normal fee and will be charged accordingly. Cancellations made with more than 48 hours' notice will not be charged. In the event of a medical illness, please email a medical certificate to info@teamkids.com.au WITHIN 48 HOURS of the absence to avoid being charged for the booking. Please refer to our website for full cancellation T&C's.



Electronic Sign-In/out

All TeamKids venues require electronic sign in/out. Any person signing your child in or out from TeamKids care MUST be listed on your TeamKids account and know your TeamKids account pin number, if this has been activated. These details can be updated via your TeamKids account at any time.



Double check Teamkids Room Location

It is very important to double check our website prior to attending, in case of a room change. We are sometimes required to temporarily change rooms due to school building maintenance over the school holidays. Last minute changes will be announced via SMS to attending families.



Additional Needs

For new families, our TeamKids Inclusion Manager will discuss attendance options for children with additional needs before they attend. Please contact Customer Service on 1300 035 000.

Please note: We require a minimum of four weeks' notice for funding applications for children requiring an extra staff member to help support their time with us. Places cannot be guaranteed if less notice is given.
