School Flooding Update

Happily, we can report that we have minimised interruptions to children's learning due to the flooding. Our office remains impacted. The reception and admin office has been temporarily relocated to my office. Dryers are still required in the hall, music room, piano room and office. There will be a further inspection of floors and walls tomorrow to test for moisture. The roofing report is being completed this morning and the foreman will be meeting with me later today to provide a further update. Last week Fergus Chisholm, General Manager Infrastructure Services and Capital Delivery from MACS also toured the school and will meet with me after the completion of the roofing report and the quote for additional drainage. I thank those parents who offered their assistance and those who emailed their support. This was greatly appreciated. I will keep you updated as further information becomes available.

COVID Update

Covid cases and other viral illnesses have increased significantly over the past weeks. Once again the availability of CRTs has been impacted. We will always work to ensure a CRT is employed but there may be occasions, as a last resort, when classes are split or taught by Leadership Team members. Please be vigilant to Covid symptoms and test, as required. We have RATs available should you require additional supplies.

School Security

We have been discussing the ways we ensure the overall safety of children, staff and visitors while onsite. A summary of measures that impact families is listed for your reference:

- Gower Street gate will remain locked, except at the beginning and end of the day for parent drop off and pick up. If your child is late for school and the gate is locked, you must bring your child to the office to be signed in. Similarly, if your child is collected early, you must come to the office to sign them out.
- Staff at the gate will ask visitors who they are and who they are visiting, and then direct them to the office to sign in.
- External school doors will continue to be locked after 8:45am bell so visitors must report to the office.
- All onsite contractors must sign in at the office
- Visitors and contractors must have a Working with Children Check
- All children will use internal stairs during learning times and during extreme weather days.
- Classrooms are locked when staff are not present. (ie planning time, lunch breaks, leaving at end of school day)
- The front gate should not be lifted, especially in front of children.

School Fees

Thank you to families who have paid school fees. Your payment helps us to provide the best support and resources for our children. All school fees should be paid in full by Wednesday 30 November. If you wish to discuss your fees, please contact the office for a confidential conversation.

Head Lice cases

We have had reports of head lice in Year 2, 3/4 and 5/6. Please take the time to check your child's head for lice. If found, you must ensure a treatment has been completed before your child can return to school.

Holy Rosary School is committed to the safety, wellbeing and protection of all children in our care.

Crossing safety-wait for the whistle

Our recent Positive Behaviour for Learning (PBL) lesson focused on safety when crossing the road. Unfortunately, Andrew still reports that children are not waiting for the whistle before crossing the road. Please speak with your children about this important pedestrian safety behaviour and discuss and model it next time you cross Gower St. This week we are focusing on following instructions promptly and respectfully without back chatting.



In Japanese learning this semester students in all year levels have been exploring themes related to travel.

Junior students have been learning vocabulary about transportation, finding out about the Shinkansen (bullet train) and places to see and things to do in Japan from volcanoes to Tokyo Disneyland! Students are starting to learn to read and write hiragana script and they enjoyed writing words and sounds they know with a brush and ink. For the remainder of the year we are continuing this theme by learning language for shopping in Japanese such as asking for items and saying please and thank you.

Senior students have all researched a different Japanese prefecture finding out about the festivals, landmarks and famous foods found in different parts of Japan. They took this research and their knowledge of Japanese language, sounds and pronunciation to create a flip response about their prefecture, recommending places to go, things to see and foods to try. For the remainder of the term students will be learning language related to going to a restaurant in Japan including key vocabulary, reading a menu in Japanese, ordering food, exploration of Japanese money and Japanese table manners.

PREP NEWS

Inquiry

Our Inquiry unit this term is 'Being Creative'. We have been investigating what makes a good fairytale so we invited the Drama Toolbox to come and help us explore the features and structure of fairytales. We got to explore using body language, verbal and visual cues while pretending to be dwarves, witches, wizards, dragons, mice, cats, wolves and pigs.

We really enjoyed our fairytale incursion and have loved acting out other fairytales in class.



Literacy



We have been investigating the characters, settings and problems in fairytales and have used this knowledge as a springboard for our own ideas for writing.


Mathematics

Our focus in Maths has been on data collection. We investigated different yes and no questions. We discovered that nearly everyone in Prep Sky likes pizza!

We then wrote our own yes and no questions and asked each other to find out the answer.

We recorded our data in a variety of ways including, using tally marks, listing names against the criteria, writing yes or no, ticking and crossing and using pictures.

We found out the easiest way to record our data was by using names, that way we didn't double as the same person twice and we could remember who answered yes and no. Have a look.



Fire Education

Last week the Preps had exciting visitors. FIREFIGHTERS!

We learnt about good fires and bad fires and what to do if we see a bad fire. We also learnt about what an emergency is and when to call 000.

We were also given homework! Our task was to talk with a parent about where our safe meeting place is at home. We enjoyed looking at the uniforms firefighters wear. They even put it on! We had lots of great questions and can't wait until their next visit.



YEAR TWO NEWS

Literacy



Visiting the zoo is always wonderful; so much to see, learn and admire. We set off on Friday 11th November by train to take part in the School Zoo program *Wild Explorers*. Students were challenged to discover what makes animals special (features, habitat, diet) and how they can care for them. Students were provided with opportunities and experiences to investigate animals within their environment.

As part of our Literacy Unit, students have been creating texts to fit their purpose, as authors. We have been researching information about animals to create a text about animals observed at the zoo. We first explored the topic we wanted to write about before determining if our purpose for writing was to entertain, inform or persuade our readers. We then decided on our target



audience and what form our piece would take. Ideas included a newspaper article, picture story book, comic, news report, documentary, podcast, advertisement poster, non-fiction book and an opinion piece.



Mathematics



Students have been exploring common fractions such as halves, quarters and eighths of collections and shapes.

They have been solving open-ended problems implementing different strategies. In one task the students were given a rectangular bathroom tile and they had to redesign the tile with as many combinations as they could where one quarter of the tile is blue. The design and patterns included triangles and rectangles in different shapes and rotations. It was wonderful to see so many different combinations presented by students.



Inquiry

Students are collaborating in groups to complete challenges requiring teamwork, problem solving and creativity to achieve the best possible outcomes. Students redesigned a skateboard using the **BAR** model: Make elements **Bigger**, **Add** elements and **Replace** aspects of the original design to improve the look and functionality of the skateboard.



Religious Education

We have been learning about The Rosary and the power of prayer. We made personal prayer beads and devoted each bead to something significant in our lives. You might like to create your own personal prayer beads or make a special family prayer bead.

Creating your own prayer beads.

You will need:

- One pipe cleaner



Once you have created your prayer beads you will need to decide what you will pray for at each different colour bead.



LEARNING IN 3/4



In Literacy, the Year 3/4 's have been studying different authors, to look at how they write and what it is that makes them world leading authors. We have discovered that authors like Morris Gleitzman and Graeme Base use lots of literary devices, such as onomatopoeia, alliteration, metaphors, similes and personification. With each author, we have looked at their background, to find out where they get their ideas from and to help us to better understand the way they write. We have also been working hard to incorporate these literary devices into our own writing, to make our writing more engaging and entertaining.





TO THE JEWEL


In Maths we have been learning about fractions. We have explored number triads, equivalent fractions, used fractions to solve problems and we've also explored how decimals are related to fractions. We have also extended our maths vocabulary to include words such as numerator, denominator, equivalence, tenths and hundredths.



This term the 3/4's are working towards creating their own stop motion animation for Inquiry. We have been to ACMI to find out about the history of animation and to get some tips for creating our own. We've also had a stop motion animation incursion to learn about how to actually create one ourselves. The students have worked on developing ideas and creating a storyboard and will now begin designing their set, characters and props.



In Religion, we have been learning about Catholic Social Teachings. There are six Catholic Social Teachings and over the past few weeks we have explored Dignity of the Human Person, Preferential Option for the Poor and Solidarity. This past week we have looked at how Solidarity calls us to work together as one human race and what we can do to show solidarity in our world. We also designed and created symbols with slogans that seek to promote solidarity in our school.


Alternatively, the students could do extra jobs around home to earn money to buy food. This is an invitation to give, but is purely optional.
