
Holy Rosary School is committed to the safety, wellbeing and protection of all children in our care.

YEAR 5/6

It has been a wonderful start to the year for our 5/6 students. We have settled into routines and demonstrated our school expectations and shown leadership qualities.

LITERACY

In Literacy, we have set up our Writer's Notebook, finding inspiring prompts to help generate ideas for our writing. The students had to think about 'What they couldn't imagine their life without' and 'Things that I can not stand'. We are looking forward to using these ideas to write, edit and publish pieces of writing. We have been reading about inspirational people and the traits and qualities they possess to lead others.



NUMERACY

Throughout the term we will be exploring Place Value and Number in Mathematics. We will build on current knowledge of whole numbers and further our understanding of decimals, ordered and triangular numbers.



INQUIRY

We introduced the concept of Social Justice in Inquiry. We are researching Social Justice and why it is so important. The discussion was rich and engaging. Students were able to work in groups to debate and discuss topics. Throughout the term students will explore the rights of children and available support networks. They will use their findings to create an informative SlideShow highlighting issues facing children around the world today. The aim of this is to encourage others to make a difference.



RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

In class we have been learning about prayer. We have explored the different ways we pray as Catholics while looking at how other faith denominations pray. We will continue exploring prayer, Lent and Easter. We visited the Church in preparation for our Whole School Liturgy.



BUDDIES

The Year 6 students have been fabulous buddies for our Foundation students. Building friendships by visiting them in the classroom and supporting them in the yard.



HOCKEY CLINIC

On Friday, we participated in a hockey clinic. We enjoyed learning skills with Tyson and Chris from Essendon Hockey. Training skills included movement with a ball and stick, dribbling skills and working in teams to score goals. We thank Andrea for organising this successful hockey clinic.

Year 6 Leadership

At Holy Rosary School we recognise that all students can be leaders and we have also introduced a new model of leadership for our 2023 Year 6 students. Students and staff worked together to revise our leadership structure last year. Our goal was to ensure that all Year 6 students could engage more meaningfully in leadership activities at school and in the community, and to increase opportunities for student voice.

Portfolio leaders have been introduced to provide leadership of specific teams. Nomination for these positions occurred last year and involved students preparing and presenting a speech outlining their skills and attributes as portfolio leaders. After speeches, these leaders were determined by the vote of peers and staff. In 2023 there are two School Captains, two Mercy Leaders, four House Leaders and four Special Events Leaders. Each term, Year 6 students will also have the opportunity to take on additional roles including Student Representative Council, library leader, science leader and flag monitor. All Year 6 students are also partnered with a Prep buddy and their role is to be a support, friend and guide. The Prep children were very excited to receive a surprise letter from their buddy over the holidays.

In preparation for these important roles our Year 6 leaders explored a variety of current and historical leaders at school, in our local area and globally. They recognised that Catherine McAuley, founder of the Mercy Sisters, showed leadership by offering free education to the children of the poor. She inspired thousands of women to join the Mercy Sisters and teach the poorest children in all parts of Australia. Catherine reminds us that as leaders, "We should be shining lamps giving light to all those around us."

All Year 6 leaders will be presented with their badges in front of the school community today at 9:15am in Holy Rosary Church. Portfolio leaders will also receive an additional badge in recognition of their role. We welcome you to join us for this event.

So what will leadership look like in Year 6 at Holy Rosary School this year? We can't wait to find out!

NAPLAN 2023



Annual Naplan Tests for Year 3 and 5 children in 2023 are scheduled for **Wednesday 15 March to Monday 27 March**. Traditionally, these were held in May. Each year, we schedule different tests on different days, following VCAA guidelines. Our schedule is as follows for both Years 3 and 5:

Wednesday 15 March:	Writing
Thursday 16 March:	Reading
Friday 17 March:	Language Conventions
Monday 20 March:	Numeracy

Over the next few weeks, children will have the opportunity to engage with previous tests as a way of preparing for NAPLAN. The more familiar the children are with the testing genre, the more relaxed they will feel in March.

All tests will begin at 9:30am and will be completed by 10:30am. Should your child be absent on these days, we have scheduled makeup sessions on Tuesday 21 March to Friday 25 March, also beginning at 9:30am. As things don't always go to plan, parents will be notified of any changes to this schedule. More information will follow in coming weeks. The Year 3s will complete the writing test on paper which is to be submitted as a hard copy. As has been our practice over the past three years, we will complete all other tests online.

Further details will follow in the coming weeks. In the meantime, should you have queries, do not hesitate your child's class teacher or Maria.



Wellbeing Update


At Holy Rosary School all children, families and staff are expected to be Wellbeing Warriors who look after the safety and wellbeing of themselves and others.

Anxiety in Children

As discussed last week, occasionally feeling worried or anxious is part of life. It is a normal physiological response to things changing in our world and our environment. Unfortunately for some people this can become frequent and ongoing. There are lots of reasons that children feel anxious, including triggers such as separating from parents and starting school. Some children grow out of these worries and others need additional support, such as that from a psychologist. If you yourself experience anxiety, it is important to care for your own mental health as children can also pick up on your anxiety, exacerbating their own.

At Holy Rosary, we talk about developing strategies to help children manage feelings of stress and anxiety, including mindfulness. There are a few websites that we like to use with children; you might like to try these at home. [Smiling Mind](#) is a great resource for guided mindful meditations aimed at children; they also have excellent ones aimed at adults as well. You will need to create an account to use Smiling Mind, however, it is free.

[Peaceful Kids](#) also have wonderful guided meditations for children as well as other resources and meditations for parents.



As Wellbeing Warriors here at Holy Rosary, we have a number of excellent books that teachers use in the classroom and students can also borrow, to help with feelings of anxiety. One book that we would like to highlight this week is called **Hey Warrior** by Karen Young. Hey Warrior is about anxiety. It shows children that they can do amazing things with the right information. Understanding why anxiety feels the way it does and where the physical symptoms come from is a powerful step in turning anxiety around. If you are interested in borrowing this book to read at home you or your child can borrow it from the school library.

Every child has the right to learn and every teacher has the right to teach.

This week's PBL lesson will address *Speaking Respectfully in the classroom and at school*

Holy Rosary Positive Behaviour for Learning Speaking **Respectfully** in the classroom and at school

Step 1: List Learning Intentions and Success Criteria

We are learning to speak respectfully

I can...

- define what respect looks like, feels like and sounds like
- recognise examples of respect at HR, in our community and our world
- 'Think' before I speak and act and then speak/act politely
- Speak the way I would like to be spoken to

Step 2: List a rationale for teaching the behaviour

Why is it important?

Holy Rosary School Values: Relationships, **Respect**, Resilience, Integrity, Kindness (highlight relevant values)

Staff, students and visitors will...

1. feel respected and safe
2. use words that empower, not enflame
3. resolve conflict appropriately

Step 3: Identify examples and non-examples of the desired behaviour

What would the behaviour look/sound like?

What would the behaviour not look/sound like?

Examples	Non-examples
<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Compliments• Having eye contact and using 'soft eyes' when speaking• Actively listening and responding assertively, but not aggressively• Speaking appropriately to everyone regardless of my relationship to them• Speaking politely by using a respectful tone• Using a person's name• Waiting my turn to speak	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Calling someone mean names (name calling)• Gossiping or sharing lies about someone• Interrupting them or cutting them off• Yelling• Using a disrespectful tone• Swearing• Making fun of someone's name• Speaking over the top of someone• Belittling, insulting or putting someone down (or someone who is important to them- eg: Yo mama comments)• Talking back or back chatting• Insulting/offensive jokes

Next week's PBL lesson will focus on *transitioning across the school*.


