Our New Roof

We have made several applications for funding towards a new roof and our school masterplan. We have been unsuccessful in securing government grants to date, however, not to be deterred, we have applied for State Government Funding, and this application was submitted late last month. We will wait until June to hear if this has been successful. In the meantime, we also applied for a Supplementary Grant from MACS and they granted us \$61,000 towards a new roof which is expected to cost approximately \$800,000. A project advisor from MACS is expected to be assigned shortly.

At Holy Rosary School all children and families are expected to be Wellbeing Warriors who look after the safety and wellbeing of themselves and others


Separation anxiety is usually something we see in childcare or kinder aged children and it gradually goes away over time. We do also see students finding it difficult to separate from their parents once they start Prep. However, older children can also develop separation anxiety at any time and without a history of anxiety.

In younger children it usually presents as a child being clingy or crying when parents leave. In older children it can present as your child worrying about you having an accident or getting sick, refusing to go to school and feeling sick when it comes time to separate from you.

In school aged children, it is possible that they have separation anxiety disorder. This is usually diagnosed by a professional paediatrician or psychologist. Signs that professionals will look out for include; how long the child has experienced the separation anxiety, the impact it has on their life, if their levels of anxiety are greater or experienced more often than their peers or if the child is refusing to go to school. If children have a predisposition to anxiety they might develop separation anxiety and sometimes it might stem from a traumatic event. A few weeks ago we spoke about traumatic events and children and we know that some kids will experience events differently and what we perceive to be unexpected, kids may experience as traumatic.

Supporting students who have separation anxiety can look different for everyone. Some seemingly simple things like creating a morning routine can help ease a child's mind, ensuring that they feel safe and supported. Others may need the help of a professional. You can at any stage see a GP to get a mental health care plan to see a psychologist and this allows you to claim up to ten sessions with a mental health care professional on Medicare.

Book of the Week



This week's book is one for our parents. **Anxious Kids** by <u>Michael Grose</u> and <u>Dr Jodi Richardson</u>, is a great resource for anyone wanting to learn more about what anxiety is, how it is experienced in children and things that adults can do to help support their kids to become resilient. There are tools for managing anxiety and lifestyle choices that can help to reduce anxiety in kids. We have this book in our planning room, if you would like to borrow it please see Michaela.

Holy Rosary Positive Behaviour for Learning

Every child has the right to learn and every teacher has the right to teach.

As last week was short and extremely busy with incursions and fun experiences, the PBL lesson on our assembly routine will be taught this week instead.

Holy Rosary Positive Behaviour for Learning

Lesson Plan for Holy Rosary Assembly Routine

Step 1: List Learning Intentions and Success Criteria

We are learning to: follow our school assembly routine respectfully and safely.

What it looks like: It will look like students showing respect by entering and exiting the hall guietly, listening during assembly and welcoming parents and staff.

Step 2: List a rationale for teaching the behaviour Why is it important?

Holy Rosary School Values: Relationships, Respect, Resilience, Integrity, Kindness (highlight relevant values) Holy Rosary School Expectations: Safety is our right. Learning is our responsibility. Respect is our way.

Being respectful and safe during our school assemblies is really important and routines around how we enter/exit, sit, participate etc, help our students to know exactly what is expected of them no matter the role they play (audience member/speaker).


- Sitting in a line with your class guietly
- Greeting parents and teachers respectfully at the beginning of assembly
- Joining in the prayer at the beginning of assembly
- Standing up to sing the National Anthem facing the flag, then sitting down again without talking
- Listening to the person at the front who is speaking
- Applauding the speakers when appropriate and in an appropriate way (not too long)
- Singing happy birthday together in time with the singers at the front of the hall
- Waiting quietly until your classes turn to exit the hall and then doing so quietly and quickly staying in line to ensure you exit safely

- Calling out during assembly
- Talking when asked to stand to sing the National Anthem
- Talking when sitting back down again
- Singing happy birthday in a silly way
- Talking to people sitting around you while someone is presenting at the front of the hall
- Mucking around when it is time for classes to exit the hall, meaning it takes longer for classes to leave



What's been happening in Year 2: Maths:

We have been learning about Data and Statistics. We have been conducting surveys to find out more information about a variety of topics. We come up with a survey question and ask different people what their answer to our question is. We recently surveyed the Year 3/4 students to find out what games and toys they like the best. We then used this data to determine what type of game or toy to make for our inquiry projects. We have also been learning about how to record our data as a bar graph. Have a look at some of our work!







Inquiry (Literacy)

Year two students have been following the design process to make a game for the year 3/4 students. **Research:** We researched by investigating arcade games and games other people have made out of recycled materials. We also surveyed the year 3/4s to find out what games they like.

Brainstorm: we recorded what we liked about the games researched and played at our toy incursion as well as drew some drawing for inspiration

Design: We then drew a drawing of what we wanted our game to look like. Some of us chose board games, some chose skill games.

Build: We then built a prototype out of paper

Test: We had other Year 2 students test our prototypes. We gave each other helpful feedback to improve our games.

Redesign: Using the feedback we got from our peers and what we observed during the testing stage, we made adjustments to our games to make them even better.

Have a look at some of our designs.

Here is a little sneak peek of our design process so far:







Margot, Frankie, William

Our arcade game is called 'Hop Pop'.

You have to throw a ball from 1 metre away and try to get the ball in the hoops.

The smaller the hoop, the harder it is and the more points you get. You need aiming skills to get the hoop you want.

We worked as a team and had to change our ideas from soccer to this because our first idea didn't work because there were too many rules. My favourite part was making the game and watching other people play it. We had lots of people like our paper prototype so we knew they would like our actual game.



Rafferty and Kingston

Our game is an arcade game called 'Clash'. We got inspiration from the videos we watched of other people's homemade toys. We changed our game to make it ours by adding a spring to shoot the ball into the holes.

How our game works is, you need to aim the ball to get it in one of the holes.

There are four holes. There is one hole worth 1 point, two holes worth 50 points and one hole worth 1000 points, this is the hardest one to get the ball in.

We learnt from the prototype that using triangles to hold up our game was the best shape to use because it is the strongest.

Mali and Sena

Our game is called 'The Krabby Patty Shoot'.

Our game is about basketball, having fun and unlocking new skills. It is designed for everyone to play. We came up with the idea by watching videos of other games similar, which is where we got inspiration. Our materials were mostly cardboard and paper cups. We put it all together with sticky tape and glue.



Where to next:

As we finalise our arcade, we are now thinking about marketing our games to the Year Three and Four students to convince them to play our game. We will be learning how to use technology to help us design posters to advertise our game and persuade the 3/4's to want to play our game first. We will also brush up on our money skills as we prepare to "sell" tickets for our games.

MUSIC - Class Concert in Week 7

We will host our final class concert of the year in week 7 (15th and 16th of November). We had many great performances in our last class concert, and I'm sure students are once again excited to perform and listen to the performances of their peers. If students won't be here for the concert, they can video record their performance and I'll play it for the class on the day. Alternatively, let me know beforehand and I'll arrange a time for students to perform in subsequent lessons.


