

## **Science News**


## Prep

The Preps have been exploring different materials, their properties and their purposes. They have used their knowledge of materials to create party hats using a variety of materials. For the remainder of the term, they will be exploring how things move.



## Year 1 and 2

The Year 1 and 2s have been learning about light, where it comes from, and how it travels through different materials. They have conducted experiments testing if materials are opaque, translucent or transparent. They have explored the parts of the eye, such as the lens and pupil through experiments. For the remainder of the term, they will be conducting experiments to test devices used to improve eyesight, why we have two eyes, and ways our eyes trick us.



## Year 3/4

The Year 3/4s have been learning about living and nonliving things. They started the term creating a criteria to check if something is living or nonliving. The students then applied this knowledge and their prior knowledge to sort living and nonliving things. They observed the life cycle of a strawberry, growing from a seed to producing juicy fruit. Did you know that fruit comes from the flowers of a plant? The Year 3/4s then applied this knowledge to other plant life cycles, such as tomatoes. They have begun researching an animal life cycle of their choice with a partner. They will record their findings on a poster and teach others about their animal's life cycle.



## Year 5/6

The Year 5/6s have been creating simple electrical circuits with copper wire, alligator clips, batteries, lightbulbs, buzzers and switches. They then applied their knowledge of electrical circuits to test if materials are conductors or insulators, using the <u>Makey Makey</u> kit. They are now applying their knowledge of electrical circuits, conductors and insulators to design a Makey Makey invention. They will design, create, test and improve their Makey Makey inventions.

Holy Rosary Positive Behaviour for Learning

Lesson Plan for Positive Skills for Learning

Step 1: List Learning Intentions and Success Criteria

We are learning to: use skills that will help us to be independent learners who can work collaboratively, organise themselves and reflect on their learning.

What it looks like: It will look like students working together as a team to complete a task, getting their belongings and equipment organised and reflecting on their thinking.

Step 2: List a rationale for teaching the behaviour

Why is it important?

*Holy Rosary School Values:* Relationships, Respect, Resilience, Integrity, Kindness (highlight relevant values) *Holy Rosary School Expectations:* Safety is our right. Learning is our responsibility. Respect is our way. (highlight)

There will always be challenges in life that we have to deal with. Being able to solve problems on our own helps to build resilience and our ability to bounce back. This is the same for school and with our learning. Sometimes we need to think creatively to solve a problem and try some alternatives before asking for help. If I do end up needing to ask for help, I need to know where to go to or who to speak to. This helps us to be independent and show integrity as learners.

Step 3: Identify examples and non-examples of the desired behaviour           What would the behaviour look/sound like?         What would the behaviour not look/sound like?
